

### MINISTERS HOLD WEEKLY SERVICE FOR CCC YOUTHS

Spiritual as well as physical welfare of CCC men occupies an important part of the Medford district program and, through the co-operation of the civilian clergymen, regular religious services are provided in all camps.

Civilian pastors in all denominations have co-operated wholeheartedly in providing services for the camps, according to Major Clara H. Armstrong, district commander. These services augment those conducted by the three army chaplains who visit the camps on regular schedules.

In announcing the August itinerary for civilian clergymen, arranged in co-operation with the ministerial association, Major Armstrong expressed the appreciation of officers and men of the Medford district for the services of the ministers, most of whom travel long distances to provide services in the camps.

### SISKIYOU ROAD GIVEN \$135,000 MORE FOR YEAR

ASHLAND, Aug. 2.—(Sp.)—Funds set aside for the continuing of construction on the super-highway over the Siskiyou mountains amount to \$135,000, and bids for the work will be received from contractors and opened sometime in the early part of September, according to Leslie M. Scott, chairman of the state highway commission, who was in Ashland yesterday with members of the board. The group in company of Jerry Thornton, Senator George Dunn, Dr. B. G. Barkhill and Gordon MacCrocken, motored to the site of construction and inspected the project.

The group agreed heartily that the Siskiyou mountain highway should be modern in every respect, and that every effort to speed the completion of the work would be made by the commission.

The \$135,000 available for continuance of construction will build approximately another mile and a half of the road and work will stop there until the state receives additional appropriations from the government. The federal government will allocate \$2,000,000 to Oregon, following expenditure of the other funds given on a free basis, if the state is able to produce a sum to match the federal funds. If this is done, the work on the Siskiyou will continue, declared Scott, but if the state is unable to match the government's donation, work will be suspended until other arrangements can be made. Commission members accompanying Mr. Scott expressed the opinion

that the completion of the Siskiyou work should go through as soon as possible. It was pointed out that the Pacific highway is and will continue to be the main arterial highway on the coast, and that every effort should be made to bring the road up to modern requirements to allow for swift and comfortable transportation and driving. The commission group continued on to Klamath Falls.
