NUMBER EXCEED 1933 HIGH MARK WITH 601 LISTED

Thirteen Exempt From Qualifying Rounds — Tommy Armour Beats Laffoon For Canadian Open Title.

NEW YORK, Aug. 4.—(AP)—A record number of 741 players filed entries for the sectional qualifying rounds for the national amateur golf championship to be played in Brookline, Mass., in September, announced today. The total entry exceeded by 140 the high mark set in 1933 when there were 601 entrants.

GIANTS' VICTORY OVER PHILS SETS NEW RUN RECORDS

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 4.—(AP)—The Phillies turned back the league-leading Giants, 5 to 4, today in the opening game of a double header but they couldn't stand against the record-smashing attack the world's champions put on in the second encounter and went down, 21 to 4.

Two major league records fell before the Giant bats in the afternoon. They topped off an already decided game by scoring 11 runs off Grabowski in the ninth to surpass the previous ninth-inning mark of ten. Since 1900 five clubs—Boston, Cincinnati and Pittsburgh in the National league and Detroit and New York in the American—had scored ten runs in the ninth.

Mel Ott, the young wallpaper who patrols right field, established the other mark when he got on base six times and scored on each occasion. The all-time big league record is seven runs in one game, made by Guy Hecker of the Louisville American association club in 1888, and several other players have scored six times but none in "modern" baseball since 1900. Ott hit his 27th and 28th home runs in successive appearances at the plate in the third and fourth frames, added a double and single, walked once and was hit by a pitched ball.
