hope that a new method of exterminating the peat may yet be found.
Will G. Metr. state relief admin-Will G. Metz, state relief administrator, brought word from Sheridan county that in that territory farmers were surprised to find literally millions of grasshoppers dead within the past month, each with a hole pierced beneath the wing. Dr. Charles W. Metz, a professor at Johns Hopkins university, and brother of the Wyoming state relief administrator, took cultures of the parasites. Preliminary scientific studies showed a winged insact lays its eggs on or inside the hopper and the eggs hatch into larvae which is believed to feed on the grasshoppers, killing them.
