

7530 SERA JOBS FOR OREGONIANS SHOWN IN REPORT

Jackson County Has 28 Projects Under Way — Hundreds of Thousands of Dollars Going Into Wages

PORTLAND, Aug. 8.—(AP)—The Oregon emergency relief administration revealed today that 710 construction and reconstruction projects, on which 7,530 men and women are at work, are under way in the 36 counties of the state.

Hundreds of thousands of dollars are going into wages on the 710 jobs, with the several counties and municipalities providing materials in most cases.

Multnomah county heads the list with 136 SERA jobs and 3,433 workers.

The number of jobs in other counties includes Baker 16, Douglas 31, Grant 9, Harney 12, Jackson 28, Josephine 6, Klamath 23, Lake 1, Lane 26, Linn 24, Marion 43, Polk 7, Tillamook 27, Umatilla 8, Union 11, Wasco 1, Yamhill 27. In addition there are 50 general state projects.

Among the new projects approved were the following: Supplying teachers in nursery school at Klamath Falls for six weeks; Josephine county food preservation program calling for canning of 40,000 cans of produce for relief families; one unit to be operated at Grants Pass city park with three cookers, and one unit at Kerby with two cookers; supplying teachers in nursery school at Eugene; teachers for adult classes at Enterprise; manufacture of cotton mattresses in Douglas and Coos counties, and nursery schools at Salem and Corvallis.

SALEM, Aug. 8.—(AP)—The manufacture and distribution of bedding materials from a mattress factory in Oregon, established by the federal government to employ persons on state relief rolls, would not be subject to state laws, Attorney General I. H. Van Winkle held in an opinion handed down here.

Van Winkle gave as the reason for his opinion that such materials would be distributed free to those on relief rolls, and therefore would not come under the laws regarding their sale.

The opinion was requested by Frederick D. Stricker, secretary of the Oregon state board of health, following receipt of word that the federal government was planning the establishment of a mattress factory for relief work in the state.

SALEM, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Vouchers for the first quarter apportionment of the unemployment relief fund derived from liquor revenues, amounting to \$44,086, were being drawn for the 36 counties today by the secretary of state's office. Five thousand dollars was retained by the state relief committee, which allocated the money, according to population, for administration.

More than \$100,000 of the second quarter funds have not yet been apportioned.

Apportionment to the counties includes Multnomah, \$14,180; Marion, \$2,532; Lane, \$2,284; Jackson, \$1,380; Klamath, \$1,339; Umatilla, \$1,024; Baker, \$703; Benton, \$694; Douglas, \$621; Josephine, \$482; and Union, \$733.

ASHLAND YOUTH BITTEN BY DOG

ASHLAND, Aug. 8.—(Sp.)—Robert Bailey, 13, was attacked and bitten by a dog near Coggins' mill on East Main street yesterday while carrying a pail of milk toward the business district.

As he passed along the street in front of the Alex Livingstone residence, the dog leaped at him, tearing his trousers leg from hip to knee, and inflicting several tooth marks. The boy was taken to a doctor, where the bites were treated against infection.

The dog is usually kept tied, but happened to be released at the moment the boy was passing. Settlement was made to the agreement of parties involved, and the dog will not be "tried."

'PLAYFUL' BULL INJURES FARMER

BIG APPLEGATE, Aug. 6.—(Sp.)—Although George Hoffman, 79, Thompson creek resident, narrowly escaped serious injuries Saturday, when his young Jersey bull assumed a playful mood and tossed him in the air, Mr. Hoffman is confined to his bed as a result of shock and painful bruises.

Engaging with an attempt to drive his pet from the field, Mr. Hoffman was knocked to the ground when the bull approached from the back and hooked him. The animal then threw him in the air, and finished his playful antics by rolling his victim on the ground. Mr. Hoffman was able to regain his footing, and picked up a rock, whereupon the bull retreated.

Dr. J. C. Smith of Grants Pass was summoned to determine the extent of injuries.


