their demands for action and neither the demand nor the action has reached the end of the road."

President Roosevelt digressed from his prepared address to mention by name "Bob" LaFollette and Ryan Duffy. With Senator LaFollette, Republican Independent and candidate for re-election on a new party ticket, and Senator Duffy, Democrat chosen with him in 1932, sitting by his side, the president spoke of them by name in that part of his speech thanking them for co-operation and referring to them as "both old friends of mine."

The president referred to the "new deal" as "a square deal" and quoted from a speech in congress in this connection generally attributed to Representative Burke (D., Neb.) who is running for the Nebraska senatorial nomination against Governor Bryan.

Critics Mentioned.
Mr. Roosevelt spoke strongly about the critics of the administration's efforts, naming those "whose objectives are wholly right and wholly progressive," but who insist upon their "own methods and nobody else's."

He said the "other type" is the "individual who demands some message to the people of the United States that will restore what he calls 'confidence'."

"Those who would measure confidence in this country," he emphasized, "in the future must look first to the average citizen."

COINS TO REMAIN IN CIRCULATION SAYS NEW ORDER

were on record as held in depositories recognized by the commodity exchanges.

Newly-mined silver, which is regularly being purchased at 64 1/2 cents an ounce under the president's proclamation of December 21, 1933, is exempted from the order, and will be bought as heretofore.

Also exempted in addition to United States coins are foreign coins, ore, silver owned by foreign governments and foreign central banks, and the silver in fabricated articles.

Overthrows World Bloc
First to comment on the administration's action was Senator Thomas (D., Okla.), a senate silver bloc leader, who hailed it as the "overthrow of the world-wide gold bloc."

He said the world would have to follow the same course and thus lead to a new international monetary system. He also forecast it would bring an international agreement on money "which will be the beginning of a new era of prosperity."

First hints of nationalization were given last night when Morgenthau ordered each \$100 worth of silver, or more, imported from abroad must be accompanied by a consular invoice. Exempted from this order were bullion already in transit, that imported for re-export and the crude metal.

The treasury has been buying silver in the markets of the world under authority of the silver purchase act over a period of months, but the amount acquired has been kept an official secret. Various estimates have placed it around 100,000,000 ounces.

The treasury holds approximately \$2,000,000 ounces of silver acquired from other sources.

License for Use
From now on manufacturers using silver for fabricated articles will have to obtain the metal on license from the government, although Morgenthau emphasized that no interference would be placed in the way of legitimate industrial use.

Senator Thomas said that from the standpoint of inflation or as a step toward establishing a 25 to 75 ratio between silver and gold as a monetary stock the nationalization move was not important. He said the government would need to purchase a billion ounces of silver to meet the ration which has been set by congress.

He contended the importance of the move was "a declaration of policy that we need silver to add to our gold as money."

"It is a declaration there is not enough gold in the world to satisfy the demands for money," Thomas added. "It is a return to silver."

MRS. BIRCH FILES ANSWER TO SUIT

Answer was filed yesterday by Myrtle Susie Birch of Ashland, in the damage suit against her by Everett Skeeters, as the result of an auto accident June 7, near the Southern Pacific overhead crossing on the Pacific Highway at Ashland. Skeeters alleges in his complaint that his Cadillac auto, driven by Byron DeFord, was damaged in a collision-accident, through the recklessness and negligent driving by Mrs. Birch of a Ford belonging to Fred C. Abel.

In the answer, Mrs. Birch denies she drove recklessly or negligently, but avers that DeFord did, and further alleges such was the cause of the crash.

It is asked that the suit be dismissed, and the costs attached to Skeeters. Skeeters, a lumberman, asserts in his complaint that his auto

was damaged in the sum of \$375, and repairs amounting to \$275 were necessitated.

The complaint also alleged that the defendant was intoxicated at the time of the mishap, and this also is denied.

Sanford, Burger and Barry of San Francisco appear as counsel for Mrs. Birch.

BEAT-UP GANGSTERS HOLD TO GRAND JURY

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 9.—(AP)—Eleven men arrested during the waterfront strike here, on charges of assault and battery, appeared in court here last night at the first night session of police court in several years and, through their attorneys, waived hearing.

Municipal Judge Long then ordered the 11 held for country grand jury investigation.

Other cases resulting from the strike, when "beat-up" gangs prowled the streets, were to be heard tonight.

CULINARY CRAFT....

Spiced Fruits and Pickles.

Among the "hand picked" delicacies for your own table, or for gifts later on, none are more individual than your own special blend and selection of spiced fruits or pickles. Now is the best time for preparing them and here are some especially nice recipes for your inspection.

Cherry Olives.

Fill pint jars with Royal Anne cherries with the stems left on:
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup cider vinegar
1 cup cold water.
Seal tight and set away to absorb flavor.

Pineapple Pickle.

2 cups sliced canned pineapple
2 cups light brown sugar
1 cup white wine vinegar
1/4 cup mixed spices.
Drain pineapple and cut into small pieces. Make a syrup of the sugar and vinegar, add the spices and boil ten minutes. Add the pineapple and cook until transparent (about 20 minutes). Seal in sterilized jars.

Pear Chips.

8 lbs. pears
4 lbs. sugar
1 cup (small jar) preserved ginger
Juice of 4 lemons and rind of 2 lemons.
Chip pears very thin, add other ingredients and allow to stand overnight. In the morning cook slowly until a golden brown and thick.

Quince Balls.

Peel the quinces and cut balls with French cutter. Boil gently in syrup of two parts of sugar to one part of water, adding a few slices of lemon for flavor. When tender and dark red in color, place in small jars, cover with hot syrup and seal tight.

Tomato Preserves.

5 lbs. ripe tomatoes
8 cups sugar
2 lemons.
Scald and peel the tomatoes, then place in a crock, add sugar and let stand overnight. Drain and boil the juice rapidly until it threads. Add the tomatoes and lemons sliced thin and cook until mixture is clear and thick. Pack into hot sterilized jars and seal.

Spiced Beets.

Cook small beets until tender. Cold dip and slip skins. Make syrup of:
2 cups of sugar
2 cups water
2 cups vinegar

1 Tablespoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon cloves
1 teaspoon allspice.
Cover the beets with this mixture and simmer for 20 minutes. Seal in hot sterilized jars.

Pickled Onions.

4 qts. small white onions
1 cup salt
3 qts. vinegar
2 cups sugar
1/4 cup mixed spices.

Cover onions with boiling water, let stand two minutes, drain and cover with cold water and peel. Let stand in salt water overnight. Place spices in a bag and boil with the sugar and vinegar 10 minutes, then remove the spices. Drain the onions and drop into the boiling vinegar. Bring them to a boil and then pack in hot sterilized jars and seal tight.

Ice Water Pickles.

Wash and cut up 2 quarts of cucumbers. Soak in ice water two hours then pack in jars with two or three small onions, a stalk of celery and one teaspoon of mustard seed to each quart.

gar, one-fourth cup of salt and one cup of sugar, cool and pour over the pickles in the jars. Seal tight.

Bread and Butter Pickles.

25 small cucumbers
8 onions
Slice and soak in cold water overnight.

Bring to a boil:
1 quart vinegar
2 cups sugar
1 teaspoon celery seed
1 teaspoon turmeric
1 teaspoon mustard (powdered)
1/4 cup salt

Pour this mixture over cucumbers and let stand 1 hour, then bring to a boil for three minutes (in granite pan). Place in jars and seal tight.

Olive Oil Pickles.

3 qts. small cucumbers, sliced
1 qt. vinegar

1/4 cup sugar
2 tablespoons celery seed
1 tablespoon mustard seed
1 cup olive oil
1/4 cup salt.

Wash and slice the cucumbers and mix with other ingredients. Store in covered jars without heating and it will be ready to use in one month.
