

TRUCE DECLARED IN BATTLE OVER PRICE ON PRUNES

SALEM, Aug. 10.—(AP)—A truce in the controversy between canners and growers regarding prune prices set by the control board, was called last night at a meeting between the control board and some 250 growers and six of the leading cannerymen in this section.

Probable court action attempting to force canners to pay code prices for green prunes, and to forestall any attempts by growers to sell at a lower price, was averted as the two factions in the dispute last night agreed to abide by the code until a three-day review could be made.

The compromise apparently removed a dangerous situation yesterday when canners had expressed dissatisfaction with prices as set by the board, by posting lower price lists of their own. The situation affected directly 9000 Oregon prune growers who were said to have a total investment in their industry approximating \$10,000,000.

Under the compromise plan the canners agree to three specific proposals and the growers made promises aimed to prevent litigation in the court.

Growers said no "picketing" of canneries would be permitted until a definite decision was reached, although they insisted that code prices must be met.

Canners agreed to pay code prices for prunes purchased today and tomorrow and indicated that green fruit would be bought.

The prune control board promised to hold an open hearing at the statehouse here Saturday to hear such complaints as canners wish to make against the code, which they assert imposes unjust prices for green fruit. All members of the board will be summoned here to attend the meeting.

SERA CANNERIES BEING KEPT BUSY

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 10.—(AP)—Headquarters of the state emergency relief administration said today that as many as 1,500,000 cans may be used by the SERA vegetable and fruit canneries now being operated in several counties. To date, 428,000 containers have been purchased.

Hundreds of families, some with seven or eight children, are rushing to the relief canneries, and from 600 to 700 cans a day are being turned out for those on the state's relief rolls.

Thousands of cans of prunes have been canned. Corn, beans, and tomatoes and tomato juice are being used. The relief headquarters said that one farmer who has a large family, traveled 22 miles to the Oregon City cannery to can his produce for his family this winter.

2 PRUNE GRADES FOR CANNERIES

SALEM, Aug. 10.—(AP)—Two grades for canning prunes this year were announced last night, following a meeting here of members of the state agricultural department, the prune control board and a few canner representatives. They were announced as Oregon No. 1 and culls.

Oregon No. 1s were defined as prunes of one variety which would be well colored, well formed, mature but not overripe or shriveled, free from mold and decay, and from damage caused by cuts, dirt, hail, sunburn, drought, excessive russeting, insects, mechanical or other means.

Culls would consist of any fruit which did not meet the requirements of the better grade.

FORMER IOWANS WILL PICNIC AT CHAMPOEG

An event of unusual importance to former Iowa residents is scheduled for Champeog on Sunday, August 19, the site of last year's Iowa picnic. At that time more than 700 Hawkeyes gathered in an old fashioned reunion and listened to such men as Dr. E. J. Anderson, president of Linfield college, and Dr. O. H. Holmes, of Forest Grove, another well known former Iowan. This year Dr. Elmer Fridell, of Seattle, formerly a newspaper reporter on an Iowa country daily, will be one of the headliners. Chas. Thomas, Oregon's Commissioner of Utilities will have a place on the program as will Dr. Holmes.

Former Iowans are urged to go early, bring their dinner and enjoy a real inspirational reunion.

BAG FACTORY BURNS ON S. F. WATERFRONT

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 10.—(AP)—A spectacular fire that attracted several hundred spectators, virtually destroyed the Western Bag factory near the waterfront here early today.

Most of the city's downtown apparatus responded to three alarms. Three weeks ago the factory's annex, located across the street from the main building, was burned at a loss of \$10,000. No estimate was made of damage to the factory. Origin of the fire was undetermined.

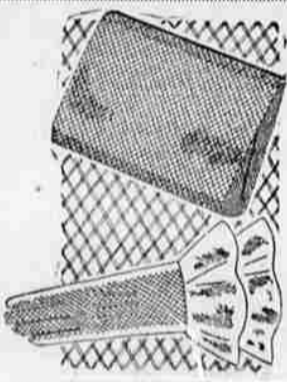
