## "Toggerly Bill" Isaacs in Action

Controlled power is the secret of successful fly-casting. The authority for this statement is no less than "Toggerly Bill" Isaacs, famous southern Oregon angler and winner of the accuracy fly event of the Western Association of Scientific "Tuggerly Clubs" tournament held in Portland, Ore., in July. "Toggerly Bill," who scored the exceptional percentage of 98 in this difficult event, is the "old maestro" of Rogue river fishermen, and those who match their skill with the elusive steelhead of the Rogue claim that Bill knows every fish in the river by its first name.

"Certainly, 'controlled power' plays a paramount part in angling, just as it does in every sport," Isaacs says. "Power and accuracy in casting are secured through proper control of the wrist and forearm. Proper timing, also of utmost importance, is achieved only through practice."  
To score 98 in the accuracy fly event in a tournament second only to the national meet is controlled power, just like Gilmore Red Lion gasoline. "Toggerly Bill" Isaacs also won the distance and accuracy events of the coast-wide tournament held in Medford, early in June, one of the feature events of the Oregon Diamond Jubilee celebration.

The accompanying photograph shows the famous angler dropping a royal coachman pool near his favorite steelhead pool near his pretentious log fishing lodge on Rogue river. Many distinguished fishermen, among them ex-President Herbert Hoover, have enjoyed the warm hospitality of genial Bill at his Big Rock lodge and received his personal introduction to the steelhead that has made Rogue river famous throughout America.
