ROSEBURG, Ore., Aug. 12.—(AP)—The Roseburg Legion baseball team became a contender for the state American Legion championship Sunday afternoon when the Eugene Juniors were beaten, 18 to 2 for Roseburg's second consecutive victory. Saturday's game, a thrilling 12-inning battle, was won, 5 to 4. Eugene took a five-inning consolation game Sunday, 9 to 7.
