**PLENTY OF FOOD,
FEWER SIRLOINS,
WALLACE CLAIMS**

WASHINGTON, Aug. 11.—(AP)—Food prices will be "materially higher" next year, says Secretary Wallace, but no shortage is expected. The drought, which has driven prospective food and feed supplies down to the lowest point in 30 years, is responsible. In 1935 consumers will not enjoy the "customary supply of sirloin steaks and pork chops," Wallace declared, "but there will be plenty of food to keep everyone in the best of health."

Federal Food Purchase Program Planned

Food Prices Higher.
There has been a 17 per cent increase in food prices over last year, according to the American Institute of Food Distribution. This is 10 per cent beyond the speculative peak of 1933 and equals the levels prevailing in the spring of 1931.

LIVING COSTS TO RISE

Wallace Feels Increase Will Not Exceed 7 Per Cent.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 13.—(AP)—Secretary Wallace said today he felt the general cost of living would not increase more than 6 or 7 per cent during the coming winter. The secretary of agriculture, however, conceded the cost of food—due to the drought and acreage reduction programs—probably would rise more than that. He attempted no estimate for food costs.

"It is the worst drought in this country," said Wallace, "but there will be plenty of food if we use common sense."
