JULY GAS SALES OVER LAST YEAR

SALEM, Aug. 17.—(AP)—The recent prolonged strike in Portland apparently had little effect on gasoline sales in the state, as last month's sales totaled 15,896,884, or 1,530,862 gallons more than in July last year, it was reported today.

July's gasoline sales brought \$781,629 in taxes to the state, an increase of \$76,532 over last year.

An increase of 6,094,702 gallons in sales for the first seven months of 1934 was noted over the same period last year. So far sales have amounted to 95,580,103, bringing in total tax receipts of \$4,779,005, nearly a million dollars greater than in 1933.
