of his candidates and asserted bluntly that he had "no intention of surrendering the city to the militia without an effort."

Governor O. K. Allen, "General" Long's major dome, hopped from Baton Rouge to New Orleans at Long's beck and command. Nobody guarded him and he claimed no troops. He awaited the "Kingfish's" orders to declare martial law over all of New Orleans.

Long a Dictator

The tolling of noon brought to the shoulders of Senator Long the toga of a "dictator." At the stroke of the hour, the numerous laws passed at his direction during the recent special session of the legislature became operative.

Walmesley's commission council today adopted ordinances prohibiting persons from having bodyguards and prohibiting the presence of armed men, except policemen and deputy sheriffs, at the polls on election day.

The first was aimed directly at Long, who is constantly protected by bodyguards while in New Orleans. As the full military strength of the state descended on New Orleans, barracks on the edge of the city with provisions for 800 men, were overcrowded and incoming detachments were quartered in warehouses along the waterfront.
