**TRACTOR CONCERN ESTABLISHED HERE**

J. T. Brewer and son, George, of Medford have been appointed by the Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing Co. as their agents in the Medford and Klamath Falls territory. The new firm will operate under the name of the Brewer Tractor & Equipment Co. For the past several years they have been engaged in the contract hauling business. They have in the past operated under the name of the Oregon California Trucking Co. They will still continue their former business under the old name.  
A show room has been established at 128 South Riverside, where the Allis-Chalmers track type oil and kerosene tractors can be seen. Dan Howard, who for the past several years has been connected with tractor and implement sale in Medford, will assist the new company in their new venture. It is the plan of the company to carry in Medford a complete stock of tractors, implements, combine harvesters and various lines that the Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing Co. manufacture as well as a repair shop for the different units. The Allis-Chalmers tractor is somewhat new here in Medford, but the general line built by this company is quite in evidence. The power equipment in the Copco power house at Prospect is made by this company, as well as the sawmill machinery in the Owen-Oregon mill. The Skeeter brothers of Talent, Ore., purchased a new 75-horsepower tractor of the oil engine principle from the new company in May and this machine has been a wonderful success in the logging show that it was placed in. This tractor differs from the Diesel tractor in that it does not carry such high compression in the cylinders, working under 125 pounds per square inch, where the Diesel tractor works with 300 pounds and more per square inch. The fuel economy is the same in both the oil per engine and the Diesel engines use the same grade of fuel.  
Much interest is being developed here in this new tractor as there is a size for all types of work. The price for this tractor is especially adaptable for orchard work. Both J. T. and George Brewer feel that Medford is the proper place to start a business of this type and are satisfied that with the fair prices for the crops both here and at Klamath Falls that they will get some very fine business this coming season with this new line of equipment.

**TRUCE COMES IN NEW ORLEANS WAR**

NEW ORLEANS, La., Sept. 7.—(AP) —A truce between Senator Huey P. Long and Mayor T. Semmes Walmsley sought comparative peace to the New Orleans battleground today.  
The rivalry for political control of the city argued not to use armed men at the polls in Tuesday's Democratic primary—the showdown—unless they were ordered out by an arbitration committee.  
Mayor Walmsley also accepted one point in the dictatorial program issued by Senator Long. He gave recognition to the parole powers granted to the police jury commissioners by the state legislature which conferred upon Long his powers.  
This compromise of differences put a damper on the strong talk that has thundered forth between the opposition camps since the coming of New Orleans itself was calm.
