

PARADE TO OPEN GOLD HILL FAIR 9:30 SATURDAY

Program of Events Will Fill Whole Day — Big Free Salmon Bake to Be Feature During the Evening

GOLD HILL, Sept. 12.—(Special)—From the time of the big parade featuring the school children and their floats, and floats of business houses, the parade starts at 9:30 Saturday morning on Main street at the intersection of the last walk fade away at night, Gold Hill fair visitors will be royally entertained by this town which will be host to crowds from far and near at its fair.

Arrangements have been made so that those attending will be able to enjoy a complete day of a fair of the real old-fashioned type, and instead of a program crowded with the prosaic free attraction and side shows of the midway, they will find a typical country fair which stresses its exhibits and leaves a few minutes for neighbors and old friends to visit.

Breakfast
A basket lunch at noon with free coffee provided by the fair committee, and the big free salmon bake in the evening enables visitors to spend the entire day in Gold Hill.

Most of the activities are centered in the city hall just two blocks north of Main street. Immediately following the parade there will be a school program at the hall, and the picnic will be served there at noon. On these grounds, also, the free salmon bake, which is the big drawing card for the evening, will be enjoyed. Plans have been made to obtain fresh salt water salmon at the mouth of Rogue river for the bake.

Ball Game
Sports will be the big attraction of the afternoon, starting at 1 o'clock on the ball grounds. Races open to everyone include the sack race, bun race, cracker race, relay, foot race, paper sack race, three-legged race, needle and thread race (team of boy and girl), and the slow car race. Suitable prizes will be given to winners of all these divisions.

A ball game is scheduled to start at 2:30 between the Medford Rogues and the Gold Hill team. Immediately following the game there will be the greased pole climbing contest for everyone under 20 years of age who may wish to enter. The cash prize of \$25.00 goes to the first person who reaches the top of the 16-foot pole. Then comes the greased pig chase which is open to anyone over 16. The prize will be a cash collection.

Dance in Climax
A big dance at the pavilion on the highway in the evening will climax the day's program. Music will be furnished by Al Stewart and his Night Owls.

Displays at the city hall will be open following the parade and everyone is again urged to get their exhibits in by Friday evening. Prizes which will be given in every department are:

Baked Goods
Best baked bread—50-lb. sack of flour; sponge and angel food cake—25 lbs. sugar; butter cake, 25-lb. sack of flour.

Canned Goods
Person taking largest number of prizes in canned fruit display—One dozen quart jars; person taking largest number of prizes in canned vegetable department—two granite kettles.

Flowers
Best display—vases.

Fancywork
Quilts—Patch work, finger wave and shampoo; applique, \$1 cash prize; lunch cloth, year subscription to the Gold Hill News; pillowcases, box of sewing thread; scarf, box of stationery; pillow, box of stationery.

CALIFORNIA HUNTER IS SHOT FOR DEER

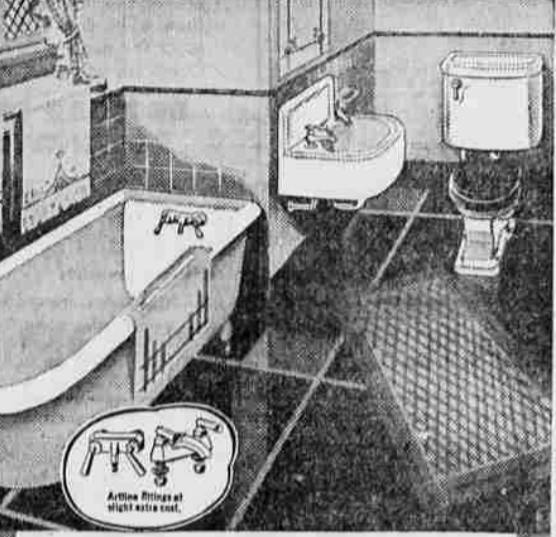
