

KABELE ELECTED PRESIDENT LOCAL MINISTERIAL ASSN.

"Fourth—That these resolutions be spread on the minutes of this association; that a copy of the same be presented to the Rev. W. J. Howell, one to the Presbyterian church of Medford one to the press and one to the Presbytery of Southwest Oregon.

their friends, old and new, at the services Sunday.

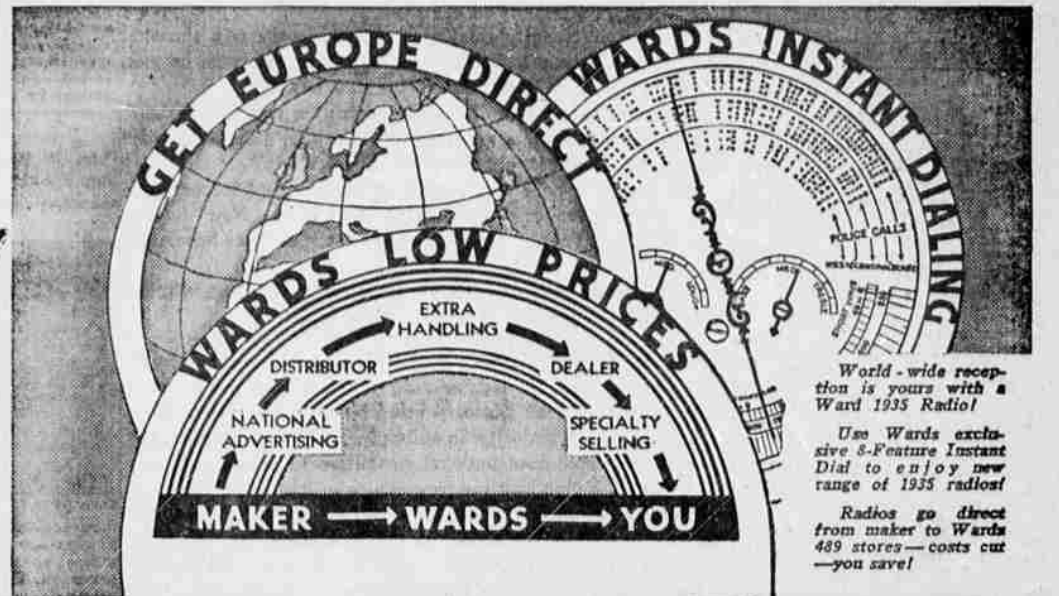
Big Mouth Bass in Streams.

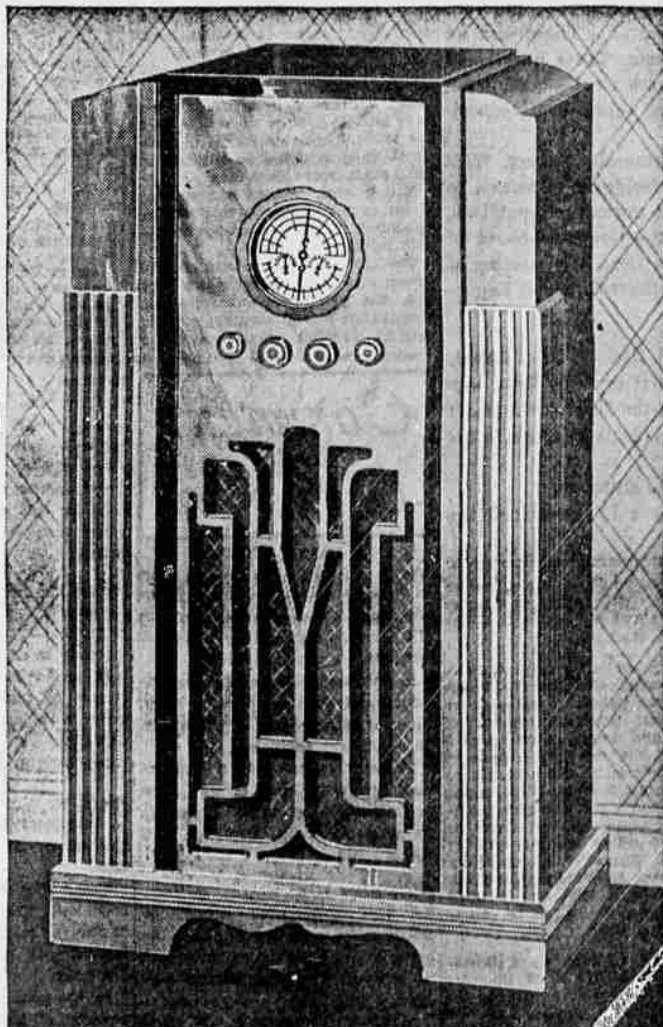

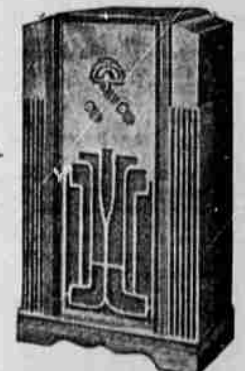
