

SIX TAKE EXAMS FOR OFFICIATING FOOTBALL GAMES

Six football officials who are seeking positions at games in this district during the 1934 season, attended the training school and examinations held yesterday afternoon at the senior high school, with Douglas Lowell, prominent state official, in charge. Those taking the exams were Sherman B. Smith of Grants Pass, L. L. Deal of Grants Pass, Albert J. Peake of Grants Pass, H. A. Hobson of Ashland, Frank M. Beer of Grants Pass, and Clyde G. Young of Ashland.

Positions included in the examinations, which were based on experience at officiating in games during the past four years, were umpire, referee, head linesman and field judge. Darwin K. Burgher, Medford coach, stated that Lowell will announce the standing of the officials as soon as he has graded their examinations.

There will be three classifications of officials: "A," certified; "B," approved, and "C," probationary. Examinations will be held annually, to allow each member to raise his standing. Lists of the members of the officials' school will be printed for the use of all Oregon high schools, with the primary purpose to ensure a better class of competition.

Burgher stated that if the plan is found satisfactory, training schools for basketball officials will be held this winter.

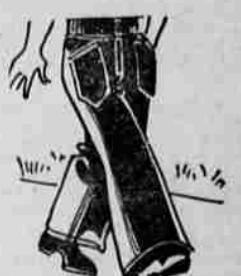
