

### RETAIL BUSINESS CONTINUES GAINS AS INDUSTRY LAGS

revenue freight for the week ended September 8 were 562,730 cars, a decrease of 63,050 under the preceding week due principally to the Labor Day holiday. The loadings also were 15,203 cars under the corresponding week in 1933 but were 61,193 above the corresponding week in 1932.

Miscellaneous freight loadings during the week were 205,535 cars, a decrease of 28,063 below the preceding week and 1,308 below 1933, but 22,230 above 1932.

Less-than-carload merchandise totaled 141,373 cars, a decrease of 21,466 under the preceding week, 7,173 under 1933 and 6,559 below 1932.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 14.—(AP)—Continued decline in lumber orders, shipments and production was reported for the week ending September 8 by the National Lumber Manufacturers' association.

Figures obtained by the association from 1,348 mills throughout the country showed a production of 172,883,000 feet for the previous week, shipments of 167,937,000 feet against 214,040,000 and orders of 189,391,000 feet compared with 194,899,000 feet.

### BELLS OF GOLD EVANGEL'S TEXT

Evangelist J. L. Isaacs of Seattle, speaking at the Pull Gospel Tabernacle last evening, used a text found in Ex. 28:33-35, "Bells of Gold and Pomegranates."

No official notice of the revocation of the license for the Pine Cone Inn, a beer parlor located near the north city limits, as reported from Salem and Portland, has been received from the state liquor commission, by county authorities.

According to reports, a petition protesting the operation of the resort, signed by 196 people, was filed with the state liquor commission.

Under the law, the owners of the resort are entitled to a hearing before the liquor commission. No date has been set yet. The manager of the place went to Portland for a meeting with the commission.

The resort has been popular with Rogue River valley beer drinkers since its opening, and featured a large glass of brew.
