

BUTTER, EGG MARKET HOLDS STEADY AFTER WEEK'S FLUCTUATION

PORTLAND, Sept. 14.—(AP)—Portland butter market was about steady after a week of considerable fluctuation. Receipts were comparatively light and about meet the demand. Good call for 80 score was reported.

The local egg market rules steady to firm with receipts light. Outside orders were reported liberal. The local movement into retail was good. Local cheese market was said to be in a good position. The demand is holding up and supplies are readily absorbed.

Market on country-killed lambs was reported firm with quotations ranging 11 to 12 cents. Other meats were fully steady with hags alone somewhat slow.

Although the local poultry market was in a good position generally, some lines have lost some of the strength of the past two weeks. Springs were more plentiful at 16 cents and heavy hens likewise at 14 to 14 1/2 cents. In the turkey market old hens were quotable at 17 to 18 cents and old toms at around 15 cents.
