Unique Mystery Hit at Rialto



One of the most startlingly original screen stories ever filmed, "Crime Without Passion," is at the Rialto theatre for today and Monday with Claude Rains, the star of "The Invisible Man," heading the cast.

"Passion" tells of a perfect crime—that almost succeeded.

Rains plays the role of a swaggering, ruthless, unscrupulous criminal attorney, a man who believes that "the only crime punishable by law is stupidity." Yet for all his cleverness, he is shown as a man who mixes his love affairs. To rid himself of one whom he no longer loves, he prepares to create a perfect alibi after murdering her. How he almost succeeds in his attempt to cover his crime forms the basis of most of the action.

The "hook" of the film however, is not entirely in the story but in its original treatment and photography, the latter of which was done by Lee Gurnes, winner of the Academy Award for his cleverness and originality.
