CAVE-IN CLOSES SHAFT OF MINE

ASHLAND, Sept. 25. — (Spl.) — A huge cave-in at the Ashland mine last week completely closed the south shaft, between the "500" and "600" levels. One of the pumps with hose and attachments was buried and all pumping connections destroyed.

This is a downward continuation of the large cave encountered in the "500" level last spring. A crew has been engaged for several months in an effort to repair this section of the mine and work was in progress in an attempt to reach the "600" level when the cave closed the shaft.

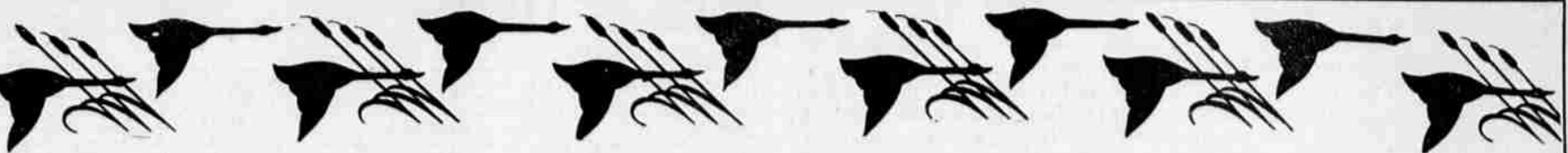
