What Price Insull?

A SUBSCRIBER asks just what crime Samuel Insull committed, if any.

We believe the technical charge is using the mails to defraud. But as previously stated in this column, we shall not be surprised if he is acquitted.

Our view of the case—which may or may not be correct,—is that Insull is neither a crook nor a swindler. He is—or was—just a typical promoter, with acquisition of money and power, as his sole objective in life.

He played the game selfishly, greedily, but not in an essential sense, DIFFERENTLY, from the way it had been played for generations, and particularly during the golden days of the Harding and Coolidge administrations.

He wanted to make money—he wanted to make it quickly and in large quantities. He was shrewd, resourceful and really knew the light and power business.

THAT was his crime. But when he was functioning so brilliantly it was not so considered. Scores of big bankers and market manipulators on Wall Street had done and were doing the same thing.

Just what was it? Well, it's a long and highly involved story, but briefly it consisted largely of stock manipulation through holding companies and investment trusts.

It was only six or seven years ago that Samuel Insull formed two companies known as Insull Utility Investments, Inc., and Corporation Securities Company of Chicago.

Insull for example transferred his Middlewest stocks to Insull Utility Investments, and received from Insull Utility Investments, nearly a million shares of common stock, and warrants to purchase more stock aggregating another million.

JUST to show how fast Insull worked, this new company was organized December 27, 1928 and by January 17, 1929 all preliminaries were completed.

Then there were the warrants, entitling the holder to buy common stock at \$12 to \$15 a share, within a given period—which could be sold at that time for ten times as much.

Not content with this, Insull sold stock in this Insull Utility Investments to his Corporation Securities company.
