Value of Silver Continues Climb

NEW YORK, Oct. 16.—(AP)—Foreign silver for domestic industrial use was advanced to another new high since 1929 today at 55 1/2 cents an ounce, up 1/4 of a cent from yesterday.

Today's boost was made despite the fact the metal held unchanged in the London market at 24 1/2 pence an ounce. Since last week, when the first of a series of advances occurred in the metal, the markup in New York was always accompanied by higher prices in London.
