BURGER LAUDED BY EX-COACH OF IDAHO 'U' SQUAD

Coach Darwin K. Burger's visit to Eureka Saturday with his Medford high school grid team drew the following published comment from Charles Erb, Jr., former Idaho university coach, now a resident of the seaport city:

When the Medford high school football squad puts up at the Vance hotel this afternoon there will be with them, Darwin Burger, former University of Idaho football star who is now coaching the Medford gridiron players.

Burger was one of the greatest ends that the Vandal team had during the years of 1926-27-28 and considered one of the finest football players of all time. Besides being an exceptional man on both offense and defense, he did the kicking for his team as well as being the passing threat.

He captained the Idaho 1927 Pacific coast intercollegiate championship team, which tied with the University of Southern California for coast honors. He was a pupil of mine at Idaho during these years and, if I may say, Darwin was a source of pride to me both scholastically and athletically. For he won the Charlie Erb, Jr., scholarship trophy, given to the highest scholar in the "Big I society" for all types of athletics.

Burger was picked by the players of U. S. C., the national champion in 1928 as the best end on their all opponent eleven. Considering that the Trojans had on their schedule that season, Notre Dame, and Pittsburgh, besides their regular games in the coast conference, made it a considerable honor.

Without a doubt, Burger was the greatest athlete I ever coached and I feel because he was always a great scholar that his team which plays Eureka high school Saturday night at Albee stadium will demonstrate the caliber of man that this young coach possesses.

It has been my privilege to be very intimate with Coach J. Willard of Eureka high school during my sojourn locally. Further I may add that I have never seen two men, referring to Willard and Burger, that are so similar in mannerisms and character. My observance of Coach Willard and the manner in which he handles his boys and the character building which he instills in each individual is indeed something that every member of this community should be proud of, particularly the mothers and fathers of students attending Eureka high school.

AUSTRALIAN MUIR IS NEW TYPE FOR WRESTLING GAME

Bringing with him a new spirit, if not a new type of wrestling, one of the most interesting of the colorful matmen who have invaded the United States from foreign climes is Bonny Muir of Australia, the wrestler who met defeat at the army Thursday night at the hands of Pete Belcastro, but who is asking for another chance.

Muir, a towering, curly-headed lad in his early twenties, who carries with him a pleasant British air and talks in a decided accent of playing cricket and other English sports in his home city, Melbourne, is making his second visit to the states. With the exception of two years spent here on his first invasion, from 1930 until 1932, and the few months spent so far on his second visit, since January of this year, he has lived the rest of his life in Australia.

But Bonny did not come to America to crash into professional wrestling here as one of the "terrible" foreigners who are the main attractions on so many wrestling cards. He had never taken up the mat game seriously in his homeland, and started in this country as a meek and inexperienced wrestler. In his first several bouts Muir was kicked from post to post and given thorough trouncings by his rougher and more experienced American rivals. He slowly became accustomed to the harder, more punishing American type of wrestling, however, and learned to take care of himself by handing out some "dirty" of his own, although he was never an unorthodox grappler at heart.

Muir has the fresh, clean appearance of the perfectly trained athlete, smiles at the roughing up he received last week, and says with confidence that he believes he can beat Belcastro easily if given another try.

Muir attended school in Melbourne, taking some university work and becoming interested in athletics at an early age. It was after he was employed as treasurer of a large theatrical firm in Melbourne that he first began to think of professional wrestling. Forced to abandon his work because of the depression, Muir turned to several professions, among whom was Ed (Strangler) Lewis, for advice, having become acquainted with wrestling in occasional workouts. It was on their advice that he decided to give the game a try.

Muir has never wrestled to a great extent in Australia, due mainly to injuries he received in a match in New Zealand, on the return trip from his first visit to America. On this occasion he received a broken breast bone, and has taken his share of the knocks in the game, having also had his ankle broken, and a severe scalp wound. He contradicts the opinion of some that wrestling is not a rough game.

Among his most well-remembered experiences is a match with Gus Sonnenberg in Boston, as semi-final material on a card featuring Don George and Henri DeGlane for the heavyweight championship. Muir lost the encounter, but has the satisfaction of appearing before 40,000 people on an eight-match program.

Muir played cricket, one of the world's roughest games, he says, for the South Melbourne Cricket club, and also enjoyed swimming among his favorite Australian sports. Wrestling in his native country is not as rough as it is here, Muir says, and is promoted in 10-minute rounds, eight to a main event match.

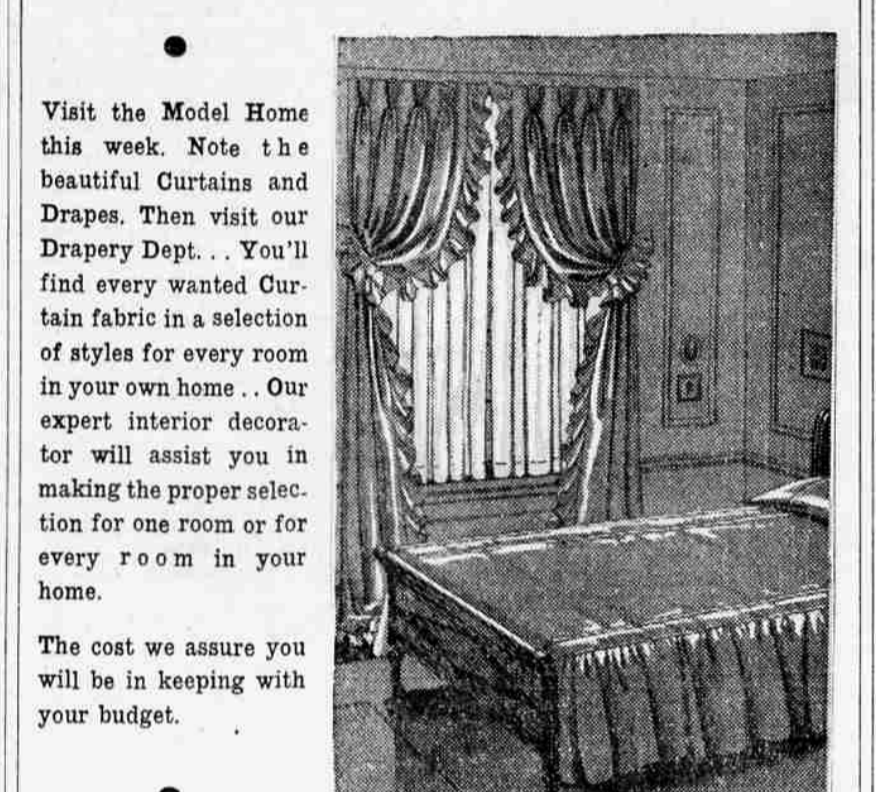

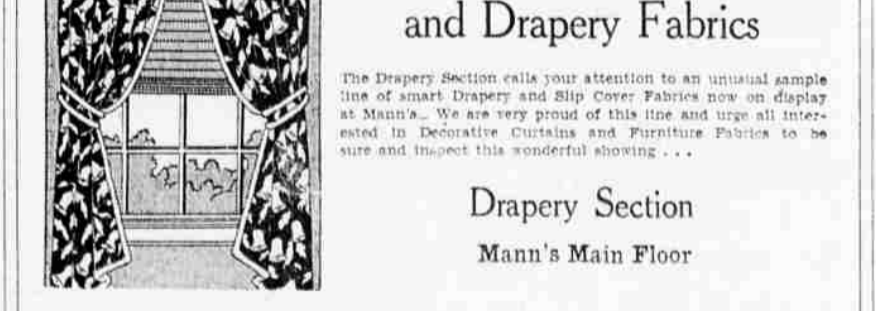
