

G. PASS ATTORNEY MAY BE CANDIDATE OPPOSING NORTON

Thomas Miller, an attorney of Grants Pass, according to reports is a "write-in" candidate for circuit judge for Jackson and Josephine counties, against Judge H. D. Norton, incumbent, who won the primary nomination, by an overwhelming majority, over two opponents.

Petitions have been circulated in Grants Pass and Josephine county urging Miller to consent to the use of his name.

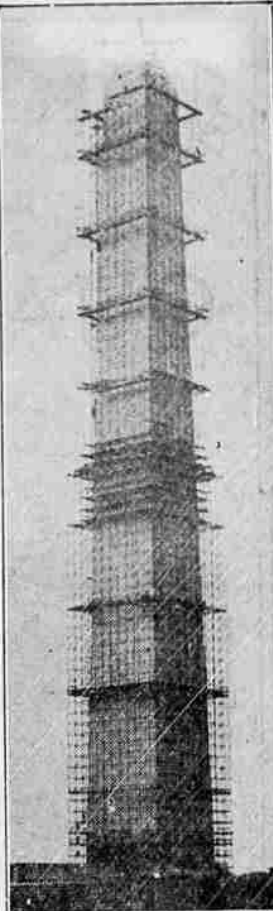
Opposition to Judge Norton, according to reports, seems to be based upon allegations that his Rooseveltian democracy is not strong enough to suit Josephine county Democratic leaders, and former disgruntlement over the manner in which the affairs of the Grants Pass irrigation district were handled. It is claimed that the "write-in" petitions were circulated for one day, and 1000 signatures secured.

Backers of the Miller campaign, announce they will launch a "whirlwind" drive the final two weeks of the campaign, and "circulate" the two counties of the judicial district.

In the May primaries, Judge Norton was opposed by Horney A. G. Hough and Attorney Anderson, both of Grants Pass. He secured a substantial majority over the combined vote of both.

Miller is described by Medford and Jackson county lawyers as a long time resident of Josephine county, with a wide circle of friends and a pleasing personality.

Interest in Jackson county local politics continues light, with the California race for governor claiming more attention than any Oregon candidacy. There is practically no interest here, in any state or county candidacy, despite Herculean efforts on the part of Republican and Democratic leaders to rouse the voters.

1679 CARS FRUIT SHIPPED TO DATE

Fruit shipments from the Rogue River valley up to last night totaled 1612 cars of pears (packed and canner) and 67 cars of apples, according to Southern Pacific freight office figures.

Between 1000 and 1200 cars of pears are held in storage and are moving at the rate of from six to 12 cars per week to eastern markets.

The first of an ocean shipment from Portland to New York city is due to reach the latter port today. It consists of 32,000 boxes. A similar shipment left Portland last Tuesday.

The jury recommended mercy. The court considered this recommendation yesterday in sentencing Chadwick to two years in prison. The maximum sentence is ten years.

LUMBER ORDERS CONTINUE SLUMP

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.—(AP)—The National Lumber Manufacturers' association said today that orders for the week ending October 13, continued to decline compared with the recent average.

Orders amounted to 172,064,000 feet compared with the revised figures for 1,373 mills of 179,200,000 feet for the previous week. Production, however, showed a slight increase from 183,920,000 feet to 185,547,000 feet. Shipments for the week dropped about 11,000,000 feet from 178,099,000 feet to 169,905,000 feet.
