that a demand for immediate payment would intensify animosities and arouse an organized opposition which will make favorable action more difficult.

Preservation of the guarantees of the constitution, the senator said, is "the first duty of citizenship."

"They seek innovations," he declared. "They believe that the concepts of Americanism have not proved sound. They would limit or deny the right of private property. They would limit opportunity elsewhere. They could cast all men in a common mold and thus take away the unequalled privilege which has been granted to the boys and girls of America to build themselves up from humble beginnings to positions of honor, affluence and power."

MIAMI, Fla., Oct. 22.—(AP)—Under bright, sun-swept skies, the sixteenth annual convention of the American Legion was called to order at 10 a. m. today by National Commander Edward A. Hayes in Bay Front park.

Thousands of neatly uniformed Legionnaires, including the approximately 1,200 official delegates and hundreds of other visitors and home folks were gathered around the flag-draped amphitheater in the palm-dotted park as the gavel fell opening the initial session of the convention at which the bonus question stands as the paramount issue.

Many View Meeting The park, which extends westward from the boy front to Biscayne boulevard, was packed with spectators.

Governor Dave Sholtz officially welcomed the delegates in behalf of Florida, after being introduced by Commander Hayes.

In his address, he said "It is our responsibility as Legionnaires to be sternly vigilant and constantly alert in time of peace to protect this country from communistic propaganda and from sinister influences."

Thomas H. Healy, assistant dean of Georgetown University's school for foreign service, told the Legion that a disarmed United States would be a menace to the peace of the world.

Arm For Safety He declared that the surest way to prevent aggressive action by other nations is to be armed in advance.

Withdrawal of Ray Murphy, of Ida Grove, Iowa, as a candidate for national commander, was a last-minute development before the initial session today.

Murphy announced that he would support Frank Belgrano, Jr., of San Francisco, the man well-informed circles say is the most likely to succeed Edward A. Hayes, incumbent.

Seattle, Oct. 22.—(AP)—A roaring gale, approaching hurricane proportions, which blew out of the southwest at daybreak yesterday, today had left a death toll of at least 17 and caused unestimated property damage in the Pacific Northwest.

Several fishing boats were lost when they were carried out to sea by the force of the gale.

Clouds scudded through a dark and angry sky while the wind bit and tore at buildings, trees and shipping and intermittent rain lashed the earth.

Two Cities Flooded The gales subsided today but two flooded cities, damaged shipping, wrecked buildings, power and communication lines tangled, much fallen timber and the death toll remained.

A revised death list follows: Capt. Bernard Thomas and four members of the crew of the small purse seiner Agnes, which sank off Port Townsend, the others lost were Leonard Torget, Leonard Berg, Ed Peterson and Howard Anderson. All were of Seattle.

Jun Yook Tung, Chinese, killed when a side of the Alki hotel here collapsed.

Charles N. Gihler, 35, killed on the road south of Port Orchard in Kitsap county when a tree fell on him as he was clearing logs off the road, blown there by the storm.

Mr. and Mrs. Carl Christiansen, each 48, of Tacoma. A power line fell on a radio antenna they were repairing.

Mr. and Mrs. John Dyal, who operated a fish trap at the mouth of the Skagit river. It was wrecked and their house on the piers went down.

R. M. Halverson of Portland, guest at a Bellingham hotel, who was working on the roof when an edge gave way.

Haiman, M. Lee, 41, of Bremerton. A tree fell on him after he had gotten out of his car on the navy yard highway and started to clear logs away.

Chris Pastow, 25, of Portland. His boat overturned while duck hunting.

Waldron Larson of Bellingham, drowned while duck hunting on the Skagit river.

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Gandhi Woman Disciple Here To Talk of Her 'Adopted' India



Carrying only scanty baggage, consisting chiefly of a khaddi cloth handbag, Madeline Slade, English-born disciple of Gandhi, comes to the United States to lecture.

She plans a two weeks' stay as the result of an invitation by the Rev. John Haynes Holmes, New York pastor and president of the All-World Gandhi Fellowship.

"I shall speak all over the states about my master and my beloved adopted country of India," she said just before sailing from London.

Her English society friends knew her as Madeline Slade, to India she is Shrimati Mira Behn, and to Gandhi, whose disciple she is, her name is Mirabai.

Madeline Slade, the daughter of Sir Edmund Slade, British admiral, who went in for fox-hunting and sports, dancing and pretty clothes, "died," she says, November 7, 1923, and in her place was born Mirabai.

She decided that Gandhi was the "light for which I had been searching," and to prepare herself for discipleship, she lived in seclusion with poor peasants, studying, spinning and weaving.

Now she is to tell Americans about India and its teeming millions, from her own first-hand observations.

Mrs. Slade, who has been twice imprisoned by the British authorities, is now 41. She is six feet tall. After a year's probationary period, she was accepted as a full-fledged member of Gandhi's Ashram, or college, at Ahmedabad. She presents a striking contrast to the little man who is seeking to make India independent of the conqueror of Great Britain.
