

FIRST LADY HAS WORD OF PRAISE FOR GIRL SCOUTS

Movement Hailed As Energy For Promotion Of Peace —50th Annual Meeting Is Honored By Presence.

BOSTON, Oct. 25.—(P)—Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt, wife of the president and honorary president of the Girl Scouts, today hailed the Girl Scout movement as "an energy for the promotion of peace."

Addressing the 50th annual meeting of that organization, she said she believed a better understanding between the youth of the countries of the world would do much to allay likelihood of armed hostilities.

She said that she believed girls of the country must be the leaders in this direction.

Youth Must Serve.
"I feel," she said, "that the more we can encourage the youth of our country to know the youth of other countries the more we will be warding off future wars. The girls, I believe, must carry the banner of this crusade and the boys will have to join in. The Girl Scout movement has the opportunity and responsibility of performing a great piece of work for the future."

As the convention opened, the wife of the president and Mrs. Herbert Hoover ascended to the stage and were seated on either side of Mrs. Frederick Eddy, president of the Girl Scout organization.

They apparently had not met or spoken to one another up to that time, and their attention was focused upon speakers who delivered greetings to the convention and who began the reading of reports.

Mrs. Roosevelt referred indirectly to Mrs. Hoover, wife of the former president, in her address.

Lauds Mrs. Hoover.
"I feel," she said, "that you have been in the past few years particularly fortunate in having as your honorary president a leader and a woman who already had long experience and interest in the Girl Scout movement. In me, unfortunately, you have not had that same experience, but I can assure you that I bring you much interest, and I have always had a particular interest in the girls growing up today, and for that reason one must have an interest in the Girl Scout movement, for that movement is exerting a constantly spreading influence not only in our own country but throughout the world, and for a few minutes I want to tell you the things which I feel the really most important things that this movement is contributing to the girl of today."

ROOSEVELT HOPES FOR CURB ON OIL

WASHINGTON, Oct. 25.—(P)—President Roosevelt is hopeful that a definite means of enforcing measures to prevent enormous oil surpluses will be worked out by federal agents now in the mid-continent field.

Mr. Roosevelt said at his regular press conference, in response to inquiries, that the department of justice had sent experts into the mid-continent field.

He said if the theory of preventing enormous surpluses was to be established there must be adequate enforcement which did not now prevail.

He offered no suggestions on enforcement methods.

FROGS BLANKET HIGHWAY AT BEND

BEND, Ore., Oct. 25.—(P)—Mystified motorists made many inquiries here today in seeking an explanation of the origin of thousands of blue frogs seen on the Dallas-California highway north of Bend last night.

For a stretch of 10 miles or more the shining, green-topped little bodies glistened in the rays from headlights. In some places the frogs were miles from the nearest water, hopping over a region which only last week was parched by the drought. Within the past few days, however, heavy rains have fallen over the area.

Motorists said the frogs covered the highway from four miles north of Bend to a point midway between Bend and Redmond.
