Profit to the State from Liquor Sales \$326,210 ON LIQUOR SALES

SALEM, Oct. 25.—(P)—Since the inception of the state liquor stores and agencies, February 15 of this year until October 1, liquor sales in Oregon totaled \$1,673,424.

Profit to the state from sales totaled \$326,210, of which maintenance and administration expenses took \$106 per cent.

Sales during the month of September aggregated \$343,348, with a profit of \$80,171 to the state.

The unexpended balance, October 1, of the \$400,000 appropriated by the state legislature for the use of the state liquor commission, was \$292,911, only \$107,089 of the original fund having been used.
