CRATERIAN DRAMA DELIGHTS CROWDS

A new star blazes across the screen of the Craterian theater in one of the year's most auspicious entertainments—the picturization of Alexander Dumas' "Count of Monte Cristo."

Robert Donat, whose only film appearance in America was in "Private Life of Henry VIII" starring Charles Laughton, proves definitely his right to be considered one of the newcomers to be reckoned with.

Dashing, handsome and with a keen sense of the dramatic Donat will certainly be seen in many forthcoming productions.

The story itself is an old one—but still a favorite after a century. The picturization of it is as new and modern as today.

Accentuating that quality and preserving all the elements that have made the Dumas novel great, the picture tells the whole story in a complete, wholly interesting manner.

Produced on a massive scale, it is the story of Edmond Dantes, the Count of Monte Cristo, his inhuman conviction to 20 years in a dungeon and his ultimate revenge.

As an innocent victim of political intrigue, Dantes is cast into the dungeon of Chateau d'If, and then forgotten. Time ceases for him until another prisoner, Abbe Faria, tunneling his way to freedom, comes to Dantes' cell.

For years the two work together to escape. The abbe educates Dantes and tells him of the fabulous treasure on the Island of Monte Cristo.

As freedom is just ahead, the Abbe dies and Dantes, sewing himself into his dead friend's sack, is cast into the sea. Picked up by roving smugglers, he eventually reaches Monte Cristo, finds the treasure and the world is his—within a way open to avenge himself upon the three who caused his tragedy.

With wealth, power and prestige, the first of the three is forced into suicide. Then the second is driven mad. But the greatest revenge comes in a stirring court scene in which the third, the cruel de Villefort, is exposed and ruined.

The romance with Mercedes, played by Elissa Landi, is faithfully portrayed but Donat, in his role of Dantes, completely overshadows the other members of the cast with his powerful portrayal of the simple sea captain who becomes the Count of Monte Cristo.

It is a great story, and will undoubtedly live for a long time in the memory of those who see it in its picture version. Robert Donat brings to the screen a vital new personality—one destined to go far.

Others in the cast include such well known characters players as O. P. Heggie, Louis Calhern, Sidney Blackmer, Luis Alberni, Irene Hervey, besides many others whose faces are familiar to all show-goers.
