

PARTY CHIEFTAINS SURE OF VICTORY IN TUESDAY VOTE

Farley and Fletcher Each Claim Gains in Congress—First Lady Again Challenged For Debate in New York.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—(AP)—In their semi-final clash of the political campaign, both the democratic and republican national chairmen tonight avowed confidence in the outcome Tuesday.

"Substantial gains in the senate" were predicted by James A. Farley for the new deal. Henry P. Fletcher said republican strength there would be retained.

As for the house, Farley said, "we will hold our present membership (309) and possibly make some gains." Republican representation in the house (114) will be increased from 60 to 70 members, Fletcher countered. "I should not be surprised if our gains were much larger."

The 33 gubernatorial contests were not touched on by Farley; but Fletcher predicted GOP state tickets would "win in all normally republican states and we will elect governors in several states which are now democratic."

While his statement conformed to pre-election tradition in drawing party distinctions, Farley's was unique. The question, as put by him, is between the "new deal" and the "old order."

NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—(AP)—Another challenge to debate was sent to Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt today by Dorothy Brooks, candidate for representation at-large on the law preservation ticket.

Challenges and acceptances, charges and replies have bounced back and forth between the two for several days.

"You are supporting my opponent (Mrs. Caroline O'Day), not because she is qualified for representative, but only because she is a financial power and she is your partner in your furniture factory and she is a friend of long standing."

"How can you ignore the fact that she is totally unfit for the office? How can you blind yourself toward the needs of the people? Is it fair to the hungry, homeless and jobless to support a candidate like my opponent for congress? What has she done to relieve their plight? Has she ever given any evidence of legislative ability?"

"The people are tired of astute politicians and political parasites. My challenge to debate still stands, or will you permit your candidate to speak for herself on the issues of the campaign?"

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 3.—(AP)—Extra police stood guard at a meeting addressed by Governor Frank P. Merriam, republican gubernatorial candidate, to protect him against "heckling or other molestation."

Workers for Upton Sinclair, democratic nominee, alleged their motor car tires had been cut by ruffians. One hundred conservation corps workers asserted they had been moved out of Los Angeles to prevent their voting for Sinclair.

AL SMITH JOINS POLITICAL WARS

NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—(AP)—To the delight of his New York followers, former Governor Alfred E. Smith has dusted off the old brown derby and once again has moved into the front lines of a municipal campaign.

"The Happy Warrior" has joined forces with Postmaster General J. A. Farley and Governor Herbert H. Lehman to help the regular Democrats defeated Joseph D. McGoldrick, fusion incumbent for city controller.

ARMY, DARTMOUTH AND CHICAGO OUT OF TITLE STRUGGLE

Illinois Beats Cadets And Yale Jinx Holds 'Big Green' Team—Minnesota Trounces Michigan.

Army, Dartmouth and Chicago toppled from the undefeated list in another day of savage football warfare yesterday, but the leaders otherwise tramped on in close routine fashion.

Perfect record collided with perfect record as Army's Cadets, led by Texan Jack Buckler, clashed with Bob Zuppke's Illini, paced by Jack Beynon and Les Lindberg, and when it was all over the Big Ten contenders still were riding high, wide and handsome.

Illinois took advantage of a blocked kick in the first period to snare a 7-0 victory.

Dartmouth, with its best team in years, once more failed to overcome the Yale jinx and finished on the short end of a 7-2 score after being decisively outplayed practically the whole way. Yale thus earned its 15th victory in a series where Dartmouth has only three ties over a period of 50 years.

Led by their two great backs, Duane Purvis and Jim Carter, Purdue's Bollermakers ruined Chicago's hopes of a Big Ten championship by knocking out the Maroons, 26 to 20.

Purdue's victory left the Big Ten race a three-way battle among the Bollermakers, Illini and last, but by no means least, Minnesota's Gophers.

The Gophers set the pace for national championship contenders by trouncing Michigan, 34 to 0, after the Wolverines had held them scoreless in the first half.

Battled for two periods, Minnesota exploded the full fury of its battering, bruising attack in the last half today to bewilder a fighting Michigan eleven with a 34-to-0 triumph before the Gophers' homecoming throng of 39,000 spectators.

It was the first Minnesota victory on its own home field over a Michigan team since 1892 and the amazing exhibition, by Gopher backs brought back to the Maroon and Gold the little brown jug, one of the most famed of football trophies.

Kostka, the human battering ram, ripped the Wolverine line to shreds in the second half, but it was Alfonso who electrified the stands with a brilliant 76-yard run through the entire Michigan team for the Gophers' second touchdown in the third period.

RESCIND SILVER EMBARGO ORDER

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—(AP)—All restrictions on the use of fabricated silver exempted from nationalization were removed by an executive order issued by President Roosevelt and made public by Secretary Morgenthau.

The nationalization order of August 9 provided for delivery of all metal to the mint, excepting that which was less than 8-10 fine, coined, silver held for the account of foreign governments and central banks and metal in manufactured articles. Delivery must be made by November 7.

Until today's order, exempted silver would not retain its status if melted and used again. The order had the effect of continuing the exemption permanently for all metal originally exempted, regardless of how it may subsequently be used.

CHILDREN SLAIN, WHILE PARENTS AWAY SHOPPING

ROCHESTER, N. Y., Nov. 3.—(AP)—A 7-year-old girl was found dead and her three brothers and a sister unconscious in their home at Fairport, near here, late today.

The victims were found by their parents, Mr. and Mrs. Alfred S. Gorkish, when they returned home.

The dead girl, Florence, and her sister, Alice, 14, were lying in a bathtub which was nearly full of water. The other children, Richard, 10 months old; Robert, 2, and Frank, 3, were lying clothed on the kitchen floor.

Florence, lying on the bottom of the tub, was not noticed by the distracted parents until the unconscious form of Alice had been removed. It was feared Alice and Frank may die.

Preliminary analysis of the contents of Florence's stomach revealed traces of poison used as a garden spray and added further mystery to the case.

The frantic parents reported they had been absent from the house about two and a half hours on a shopping trip. When they left, the children, they said, appeared well and happy.

Sheriff's deputies and Fairport police started a check of all residents in the neighborhood on the theory some fiend may have broken into the house and attacked the children, although they showed no signs of ill treatment.

POLICE DIRECTOR OF KANSAS CITY HELD GANG AIDE

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Nov. 3.—(AP)—Eugene C. Reppert, director of police at the time of the union station

shootings of four officers and their prisoner, was indicted tonight with two other police officials for perjury in their testimony before a federal grand jury which is investigating the killings.

In addition to Reppert, who has since resigned his post, those named were Thomas J. Higgins, chief of detectives, and George Rayen, head of the police motor car theft bureau.

The grand jury then recessed until 9:30 a. m. Monday when it will hear Adam Richetti, one of the three men accused by federal authorities as the killers who attempted to free Frank Nash, a train robber, from officers at the union station June 17, 1933.

Nash was slain accidentally in the machine gun and pistol fire which mowed down four of his captors.

Richetti, who was arrested near Wellsville, O., was on his way here by train after an airplane flight in attempt to get him here tonight, was interrupted at Chicago by bad weather.

The grand jury had planned to hear him tonight and then adjourn. During the municipal campaign last March, a non-partisan group charged that while Reppert was the nominal head of the department the man really in control was John Latta, a gambler and powerful north side politician.

Latta was slain in July by gangsters.

BORAH ATTACKED BY IDAHO SOLON IN CAMPAIGN TALK

NAMPA, Idaho, Nov. 3.—(AP)—Vigorously attacking critics of the Roosevelt recovery program before a Democratic rally here Friday night, Senator James P. Pope reviewed the record of his colleague, Senator Borah.

"I have always had great respect and admiration for the senior senator," he said, "and I have looked to him to guide the course of the Republican party toward constructive achievement. In this campaign, however, I have been unable to learn definitely what his position is."

"On September 6, 1934, the Idaho Daily Statesman quoted Borah as follows: 'I am a Republican—my father was a Republican. I believe in the doctrines of Abraham Lincoln. But if the Republican party does not come back and take up the fight for the American people they can count my support out.'"

"Yesterday the Idaho Statesman quoted Senator Borah: 'The Republican party has stood always for the constitution and for humanity. There is no record that equals the record of the Republican party in its leadership.'"

"Insofar as anyone has been able to ascertain," Pope went on, "there has been no change in Republican policies since September 6."

"But whether we have succeeded—that is the question to which you are to give us the answer next Tuesday."

Discussing his "EPIC" plan in detail, the democratic nominee declared the opposition "tells you it will cost a lot of money."

"They try to terrify you with visions of the state driven into bankruptcy by my hare-brained experiments," he stated.

"It needs no experiments to prove that if a million and a quarter persons are kept on public charity it costs the state money. Either it is an experiment to say that if the half-million able-bodied workers among them are allowed to go to work they will produce some wealth, and that every dollar's worth of wealth they produce will be a dollar saved to the state of California and to the taxpayers who are California's only source of income."

Sinclair declared he is not unfit for the post of governor, as he said, the opposition has charged.

"I have managed many affairs in my life," he said, "I have been

author, magazine writer, publisher, playwright and producer of both plays and motion pictures. I have run a farm, and then a colony with the care of fifty or sixty people. I have earned close to a million dollars in my life and spent it in the causes which have appealed to my heart."

SINCLAIR CLAIMS 'LIE BARRAGE' IS AIMED AT 'EPIC'

Closes Campaign With A 'Prayer'—Defends Ability To Be Governor By Life's Endeavors And Earnings.

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 3.—(AP)—Closing with a prayer, Upton Sinclair, democratic candidate, tonight delivered one of the final addresses of his campaign for election as governor of California.

"Your minds have been poisoned with a lie barrage," he declared, "and tonight, as you listen to me, you must be wondering whether I am a human being or some monster sent up to this earth by the devil in order to betray and wreck the institutions of our state and nation."

Sinclair asserted "we have answered the lies, we have defended our honor and our good faith. We have tried to make our purpose understood."
