State Grange Opposed To Limitation of Tax

The Oregon State Grange in session in Roseburg last June went on record opposing this constitutional amendment proposed by Portland realtors. It is a drastic measure proposed to relieve the tax burden upon real property, but if passed the effect would be very injurious to the property of public relief, schools and colleges, police, courts and all public services. Such chaotic conditions would result that non-property owners would move out of the state, thus depreciating property values. It is impossible to render the public service required with 15 to 20 mills. If this passed it will become a part of the constitution of Oregon and could not be changed by the legislature, no matter how serious conditions become. Our police and court functions would be so much impaired that Oregon would become the mecca of thugs and crooks from other states.

Taxes in excess of the limitations could only be voted by a two-thirds vote. This is the same old minority rule scheme voted down at the last election. This plan should never be adopted if we believe in popular government with majority rule. Its passage would no doubt result in another attempt for a general sales tax. In California the average property owner now pays more sales tax than he saves in property tax reductions. This was forcibly brought out in the recent session of the California State Grange at Salinas. Vote 303-X No.
