

First Christian Observes 50th Anniversary Sunday



Sunday, November 11, the congregation of the First Christian church will observe its fiftieth anniversary, with special services to be conducted in the morning, afternoon and evening. Mrs. Margaret Fisher is the only charter member of the church now living in this city.

The church here was organized on November 22, 1884, when Martin Peterson first acted as pastor, and continued in that capacity until his death in 1889. The first permanent location was on Front street between Sixth and Seventh streets. Later a hall on Main street was used, then the Baptist church.

A lot was then secured at Sixth and Ivy streets and a building erected in 1889 which served as a place of worship until the first unit of the present home-like building at Ninth and South Oakdale was built in 1912. The second unit was constructed in 1926.

Ministers who have served with the

church are: Peter Burnett, S. White, Eli Fisher, O. N. Gist, Brother Childs, T. M. Jones, Brother Corbin, M. F. Horn, Brother Patterson, Theodore Matlock, D. D. Boyle, Harry E. Tucker, P. B. Huffman, D. E. Millard, D. J. Howe, C. E. Mell and the present minister, W. R. Baird, who is now serving his fifth year with this congregation.

During Rev. Baird's pastorate, over 400 new members have been added to the church, which now has a present membership of over 600.

The morning service Sunday will be in charge of Rev. D. E. Millard, who will speak on "The Church of the Past." A covered dish luncheon will be served in the recreational hall at the close of the morning service, and in the afternoon a 2:30 o'clock service will be held, with P. E. Swanwick speaking on "The Church of the Present."

The evening service will be devoted to a Beth Parker program.

MEIER PROCLAMATION ASKS ARMISTICE DAY OBSERVANCE MONDAY

SALEM, Nov. 9.—(AP)—In a proclamation issued here Governor Julius L. Meier stated that Monday, November 12, had been set aside by Oregon law for the observance of Armistice day, which this year comes on Sunday.

The governor urged that, "our citizens join in a patriotic celebration of this significant anniversary, paying high tribute to the men who died in the World war, reaffirming the ideals of international justice and true freedom for which they died and praying for the world's final release from the scourge of war."

"Let us display our national emblem not only upon business houses and public institutions, but also upon private homes, fostering thereby a pride and reverence in our flag and the principles which it represents, and let us join wholeheartedly in the ceremonies planned by veterans' groups for this occasion."

last night announced a total tax levy for 1935 of \$735,779.92, or \$10.771.68 greater than in 1934. A necessary increase of \$24,000 in appropriations for poor relief and old age pensions, was largely offset by a \$19,200 cut in the road fund.
