

### SOUTHERN PACIFIC TO AIR CONDITION PRINCIPAL TRAINS

Involving an expenditure of approximately \$2,000,000, the Southern Pacific company has just announced plans for the air-conditioning of all passenger equipment used in all trains on its four main transcontinental routes as well as the air-conditioning of a large part of the equipment of its principal trains operating on the Pacific coast from Portland to Guadalajara, Mexico. The work, to begin immediately, on about 280 cars, is a continuation of the company's program for adding to the comfort of passenger train travel begun last May with the partial air-conditioning of certain trains, according to Felix S. McGinnis, vice-president in charge of system passenger traffic.

The new program gives consideration to the comfort of passengers in tourist cars, chair cars and coaches, and all such equipment on the principal trains operating between the Pacific coast and Chicago and New Orleans will be air-conditioned. It is expected the new equipment will be ready for service May 1, at the start of next year's tourist season. Mr. McGinnis said, in announcing there would be no extra charge for travel as a result of the improvements.

Leading trains included in the program for complete air-conditioning are the Cascades, between Portland and San Francisco; the Overland Limited, between San Francisco and Chicago; the Sunset Limited, between San Francisco and Los Angeles and New Orleans; the Golden State Limited, between Los Angeles and Chicago. Additional equipment to be air-conditioned for other trains includes Pullmans, tourist cars and dining cars for the west coast, between Portland, Sacramento and Los Angeles.

This extensive program of regulating the interior temperature and humidity of passenger cars will supplement the more than 100 air-conditioned cars that are now in service on Southern Pacific lines.
