

## PORTLAND LABOR RACKETEERS PREY ON TRADE IS CLAIM

### Up-State Producers Say Metropolis Is Dominated by Those Who Levy Tribute on Commerce; Flout Law

PORTLAND, Nov. 15.—(AP)—A group of up-state producers in a statement declared today that Portland has become "dominated by a coterie of racketeers, who, under the guise of organized labor, are levying a heavy tribute on your commerce."

Urging the city to unfetter itself, the statement said:

"When you consider that our wheat, wool, fruit, lumber and other products are sold in the world market and at the price the world is willing to pay for them, it becomes readily apparent that any additional charge for handling or for transportation cost ultimately comes out of the pockets of those who produce these articles of commerce."

#### Workers Beaten.

The recent longshoremen's strike paralyzed the wool market, with resultant loss, and men who wanted to work on the docks were beaten by pickets, one job-seeker being killed, it was declared.

The producers said they understood 90 cents an hour was the previous high basic wage, even during wartime. The longshoremen struck for a basic wage of \$1.00 instead of 85 cents an hour.

The strikes at the Oregon Worsted mill here and the Swift & Company plant here also were criticized by the producers who asked:

#### Law Unenforced.

"Has Portland sunk so far that it cannot control its own business and enforce the laws of the state in the protection of life and property?"

Signers included organizations or officers of organizations representing shippers, wool growers, stock raisers, wheat raisers, fruit producers, potato growers and hop growers.

## HOG PROCESSING TAX CHANGED BY NEW REGULATION

An important change in the hog regulations under the Agricultural Adjustment Act, effective November 1, 1934, is announced by J. W. Maloney, collector of revenue for the district of Oregon, which provides when hogs are slaughtered by hog producers and feeders, the processing tax will be paid by them only when they sell the products direct to consumers. In all other cases the tax will be paid by the first person other than the hog producer or feeder who performs any operation in the receiving, handling or other distribution of the product. This means if any retailer, wholesaler, commission merchant, meat market, restaurant, hotel, club, hospital or other commercial establishment receives, buys or exchanges any dressed hogs or parts from a hog producer or feeder, the first domestic processing is held to be the initial act performed by such persons in handling or preparation for further distribution or use. Preparation for further distribution or use includes any operation connected with receiving, storing, cutting, rendering, etc.

This change affects only hogs slaughtered by farmers on and after November 1, 1934. Meat packing companies, slaughterhouses, custom killers and all other commercial establishments will continue to pay the processing tax as formerly on the live weight of hogs at the time of slaughter.

All commercial establishments will be required to maintain a record of all pork products handled by them to show whether they are subject to the tax or whether it has already been paid by some prior processor or distributor. Packers and others selling to jobbers, retailers, etc., are required to include in their invoices a statement certifying that the first domestic processing has been performed by them, or that they have received a certificate to this effect from some prior owner.
