AIR BASE URGED FOR MEDFORD IN DEFENSE REPORT

(Continued from page one.)

With regard to the naval recommendations that the Portland committee has made, your committee feels there are many organizations further north much better able to recommend and suggest the needs of Oregon defense from a naval standpoint than is any committee from the southern part of the state. We therefore feel that whatever recommendations for plans of naval defense are made by the committee from Portland should be left to the interests in the northern part of the state to adhere to. As far as southern Oregon is concerned, it seems to your committee most essential that an adequately equipped air base be installed and maintained at Medford. Our reasons for coming to this conclusion are as follows:

1. Medford is the logical stopping place for military planes between the California Bay district and northern Oregon and Washington points.
2. An adequately equipped air base seems absolutely essential when the defenseless character of the Oregon coast between San Francisco and Astoria is taken into consideration. There is no railroad between Eureka and Marshfield which would permit the use of mobile coast artillery, even though we believe the coast has adequate mobile coast artillery available.
3. Medford has already been recognized by the army and is now a service point for army ships with a small personnel stationed permanently on the ground. In addition to an adequately equipped air field, we are of the opinion that a mooring mast for the dirigible Macon should be built and maintained at the Medford airport. This will not involve a huge outlay of money, and the establishment of a mooring mast will allow the ship to reconquer the coast. It would provide another properly equipped dirigible base between Sunnyvale, Cal.

and Tacoma, Wash. Medford being exactly midway between these two points.

Your committee does not feel that there is any necessity now of attempting to obtain a large force of army or navy personnel, but we do want to stress our opinion that there seems to be a great necessity for an adequately laid out and equipped air base.

Our field should be large enough to handle any number of army ships that might conceivably find it necessary to come into the northwest. This would undoubtedly necessitate increasing the size of Medford's present airport materially. Furthermore, adequate runways, hangars, shops, etc., should be installed by the army. An adequate air base would be of little value without proper defense against airplane attack. Therefore, anti-aircraft guns, searchlights, and aid defense equipment should also be installed and maintained. While your committee realizes that these suggestions involve a considerable outlay of money, it is its opinion that without this outlay and expense this particular part of the west coast is seriously threatened in case of war from any far eastern source.

Only a comparatively few men would be required to keep the equipment of such an air base in condition to be used when necessary, but this small detachment should be maintained in order that the field may be available without delay in case of necessity.
