NUDIST DWELLERS OF LONELY ISLES MAY FURNISH KEY

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 21.—(AP)—First accurate descriptions of the two bodies found Saturday on a waterless rock of the Galapagos archipelago in the equatorial death mystery established with apparent certainty that the strange empress of Charles Island—Baroness Eloise Bonquet de Wagner—was not one of the victims.
