PORTLAND GAME ON THANKSGIVING VICTORS REWARD

Locals Will Carry Edge in Weight—Applemen Stress Speed—Opening Gun Is Scheduled for 2:00 P. M.

(By Harold Grose) Two teams—Hood River high school and Medford high school— which through season's scores have laid claim to the mythical state prep school football championship, will meet on Van Scoyoc field here Saturday at 2 o'clock and settle the argument as to which has the most valid claim.

Washington high of Portland will be host to the winner of tomorrow's game, despite the fact she has been led twice and defeated once, according to an announcement made by members of the Portland high school principals, which body met last night in Portland to discuss the matter.

Medford high has the slight edge over Hood River in the betting because of the fact they are playing on their home field and that they have a slight edge in weight, if the weight charts given the press are correct.

Which team wins in tomorrow's contest will have a perfectly justified right in calling themselves mythical state champs. The Medford high school team will average approximately 164 with the line averaging 170 and the backs with an average of 153 pounds. The Hood River lineup will average approximately 155 with the line averaging 164 and the backs 146. The Hood River backfield consists of four light and speedy men.

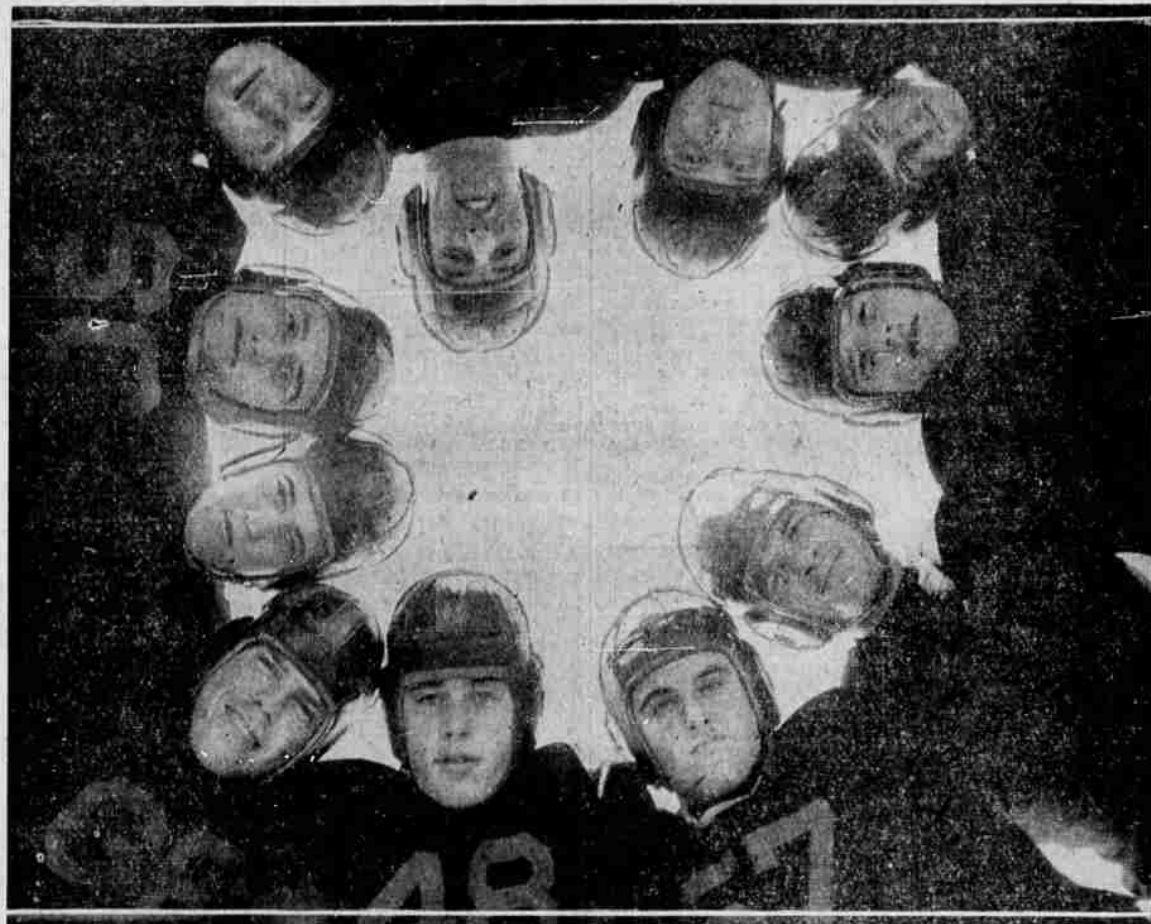
