THANKSGIVING DAY
SCIENTIST CHURCH

The Christian Scientists of Medford held special Thanksgiving services Thursday morning at 11 o'clock, in their church, 3100 N. Cascade street. The service, which was well attended, consisted of readings from the Bible and correlative passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy.

The Golden Text was taken from II Cor. (9:13), "Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift," and among the citations was another from the Bible, "Thy way, O God, is in the sanctuary; who is so great a God as our God?" (Ps. 77:13); and the passages from Science and Health included the following: "To those leaning on the sustaining Infinite, today is big with blessings." "Spirit blesses man, but man cannot 'fall whence it cometh.' By it the sick are healed, the sorrowing are comforted, and the sinning are reformed. These are the effects of one universal God, the invisible good dwelling in eternal Science." (pp. vii, 76).

Inspiring hymns were sung from the new Christian Science hymnal, and the soloist, Mrs. Phillip Sperring sang. The latter part of the hour was devoted to a unique feature which is characteristic of the Wednesday evening meetings of the Christian Scientists. At the service on Thursday, one after another, members of the audience arose and expressed gratitude for blessings received from the application of Christian Science to some personal problem. Some said they had been healed of disease and various other minor or less serious physical disorders, some had overcome bad habits, while all seemed to have had something to be thankful for in the line of spiritual growth.

BREAK IN RAIN
STORM COMING

PORTLAND, Nov. 30.—(AP)—Partly clearing weather was predicted for Saturday by the weather bureau here today.

Southerly winds were expected to shift toward the west tonight as the storm which struck the coast early today passed eastward.

Southeast storm warnings were changed to southwest at 7 a. m. The wind roared out of the south during the night, reaching a top velocity of 36 miles an hour at North Bend, at the mouth of the Columbia river.

Wants Anglo-U. S. A. Union To the Editor:

Stanley Baldwin said a few days ago that there could never be an effective League of Nations until the United States was included; but why not a more effective guarantee of peace so far as English-speaking nations are concerned, and a great deterrent from war for the others?

I have in mind a republic which would be in effect a United States of the World, instead of the United States of America, which would be made up of Great Britain and all of her dominions, with the possible exception of India, joined with the United States of America. Such a nation could not be successfully opposed by any probable combination of other nations, and that in itself would be a great aid to world peace.

The capital of this nation would naturally be upon the North American continent, where there is the largest aggregation of English-speaking people, but whether at Washington, Toronto, or some other climatically better city, is a matter of detail.

I can see the Irish Free State, which renests allegiance to England, glad to become a unit in such a nation. I can see many questions of war debts readily settled as well as many questions of tariff.

It is generally believed that the Prince of Wales does not want to become King of England, and the death of King George would mark the opportune time for the consummation of such a plan, though much preliminary work would have to be done in advance.
