Last night the president and Mrs. Roosevelt observed the tenth anniversary of his coming to Warm Springs to fight back from infantile paralysis, at a dinner unusual in feeling and informality.

The dining room of the beautiful new Georgia hall was filled with patients, mostly children, and their families who reside here with them.

Cure Resisted.

In a brief talk at the conclusion, the president recalled his arrival here in the fall of 1924, to try exercise in the warm waters of this place, which permit long swims. He told of helping to establish a foundation here which has grown into an institution. He hinted of a "larger family here" as a result of yesterday's meeting of the trustees.

About the proudest people in the United States last night were six-year-old Mary Grimley of Moorportown, N. J., who sat at the right of the president at the head of the table, and Peter Woodberry, eight years old, of Manchester, N. H., who sat at the left of Mrs. Roosevelt.

Patients at Table.

Ten other children who were the lucky ones at the drawing had seats at the table—all patients.

Their eyes sparkled as the president thrust a huge carving knife into the 40-pound turkey sent to him by Mrs. Elizabeth Manly, 97 years old, of Lamar county, Georgia.

There was a stinging contest during the dinner as each of the four long tables tried "Sweet Adeline." The president was asked to judge, and he quickly replied, "There is no question which table is best—table number two."
