

MANY TURKEYS LEFT ON HANDS

PORTLAND, Nov. 30. — (AP) — The customary Friday morning survey of coolers and storage plants on the day following Thanksgiving revealed today that thousands of pounds of turkeys were held over by Portland wholesalers and that some retailers had more than their hands full.

It appeared that many consumers would not purchase at prices over 25 cents a pound retail. The speculators, of course, were the hardest hit, for some of them had rushed into the country to outbid all competitors for supplies. Some showed a loss of three to four cents a pound on tons of birds.

The buying of turkeys for the Christmas trade is already underway, but general operations will not begin until about the middle of next week.
