Grace Moore is at the Craterian theater today in "One Night of Love," and those few words have meant box office magic everywhere the picture has been shown.

This film play can easily be placed among the group of most discussed pictures of the year, largely because of the success with which it has met wherever it has been shown, and, in addition, because it represents a splendid comeback for its star that will interest every woman who wants to stay young. Which, by the way, is just about 100 per cent for the ladies.

This is not her first picture. In 1930 she appeared in "A Lady's Morals," screen biography of Jenny Lind, and later with Lawrence Tibbett in "New Moon."

In both she appeared as a charming woman, but with the bulk of figure which the public has always expected of a prima donna. The transformation to the slim, graceful-

ured person seen in "One Night of Love" has excited feminine comment. The story has Miss Moore as the loser in a radio audition, but, even with this setback, she decides to risk all and goes to Europe to study under the masters. There, her voice is heard by Tullio Carminati, the maestro, and under his tutelage she is made into a great singer. Romance is forbidden if she is to have a career and it is this situation that causes her to finally leave Europe and return to the Metropolitan opera house for her American debut, contrary to her maestro's wishes. There is much comedy supplied by Luis Alberni, as the valet, with Lyle Talbot as the young American who wants the singer to give up her career and marry him.

Others in the cast include Mona Barrie, Jessie Ralph, Andres de Segurola, Henry Armet and Jane Darwell.
