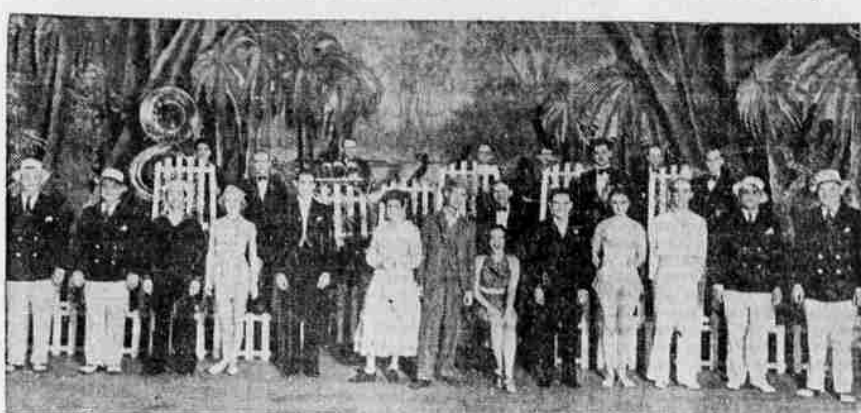

## MANY LEAP INTO RIVER TO ESCAPE TORTURING FLAME

(Continued from page one.) when they chose the icy waters of the river to the flames that had trapped them. Others were killed or fatally injured when they jumped to the streets, before firemen could reach them with ladders or spread nets at the base of the walls.

A few threaded their way through pitch dark corridors and down flame-licked stairways.

No Time to Dress  
They had no time to dress and several suffered frozen or frost-bitten feet, for the temperature was near zero and snow and ice covered the streets.

Of the missing, gravest fears were felt for Senator John Leiden, of Saginaw, who did not respond to warnings pounded on his door. For 20 minutes after the fire was discovered, a bedlam of shrieks resounded from the flames-ravaged building. Then the screams either were silenced or were drowned out by the roar of collapsing walls and floors.

Anyone who had not escaped by that time was doomed, firemen said. No Escapes at Rear  
Many of the trapped persons were unable to reach the fire escapes. At the rear of the building, where the river flows, there were no fire escapes.

Rep. James E. Helme, of Adrian, more than 70 years old, was found among the survivors. He had plunged into the river and succeeded in swimming ashore. Probate Judge William C.
