MRS. ROOSEVELT NOMINATED BEST DRESSED WOMAN

NEW YORK, Dec. 20.—(AP)—The critical eye of American fashion designers surveyed the style scene today and selected the country's best dressed women, heading the list with Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt.

They made it an all-American selection, covering several fields of women's activities, and while in the mood also nominated a best dressed baby.
Mrs. Roosevelt was selected as the best dressed American woman in public life. Here are the others:
Kay Francis, best dressed film star.
Mrs. Robert H. McAdoo, smartest dressed society woman.
Mrs. William Woodward, most fashionable dowager.
Elsa Maxwell, most tastefully clad party hostess.
Ina Claire, best dressed actress on the stage.
Mrs. John Hay Whitney, best attired sportswoman.
Gladys Swarthout, best dressed singer.

Amelia Earhart, smartest fashion in aviation.
Georgia O'Keefe, most dressably dressed painter.
Fannie Hurst, best dressed writer.
Betty Morris of Park avenue, most chic debutante.
And the baby? John Drayton Cochran, blue-eyed son of Mr. and Mrs. Drayton Cochran of New York.

The best dressed baby lies simply as befits any two-months-old infant. He affects woolly and pink sweaters and soft white muslin, sometimes with a wisp of lace. His grandmother is Princess Hohenlohe Schillingfurst, widow of Gifford Cochran, millionaire turfman.
Mrs. Roosevelt dresses with admirable taste for her manifold activities. Her clothes are conservative, but of excellent material.
Blue is her favorite color.

Fannie Hurst's trappings, incline to spectacular magenta velvets and gold brocades, topped by a severe coiffure.
Amelia Earhart has flawless sport clothes, and says they herself. So has Mrs. John Hay Whitney, the great horsewoman.
The best dressed "deb," the blue-eyed daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Gouverneur Morris, has light brown hair, chic but fairly simple clothes, and a frank, open face.
Elsa Maxwell has Air Jocond Elsa Maxwell's black satina and heavy crepes have an air. "Tuckety," one columnist called her.
The most chic society matron, the dark, distinctive daughter-in-law of Senator William Gibbs McAdoo, is individual but not ultra; she depends more on line rather than detail.
Gold dotted net, lace, sequins, little coats are worn by America's smartest dowager, the wife of William Woodward, Long Island turfman.
To Kay Francis, the whole thing is lines. Her clothes are extremely simple—often molded, with a low square neckline.
The provocative Ina Claire likes lame, and has gold lame pajamas. Her favorite colors for stage dress are red, white and blue.
Georgia O'Keefe attires herself in black with crisp white touches. Her gowns flow loosely.
Flame color or white for evening—tweeds for daytime are favorites of Gladys Swarthout of the Metropolitan opera.

FORMAL NOTICE FILED FOR PUGH

Formal notice of appeal to the state supreme court from the conviction of Kyle Pugh for criminal syndicalism, was served upon the district attorney today by Irwin Goodman of Portland, attorney for Pugh. Pugh was sentenced to serve an indeterminate term of not more than five years in state prison. Pugh's counsel also asks until February 28 for filing of a bill of exceptions and a writ of probable cause.
Pugh, pending legal action, is still in the county jail, in lieu of \$1000 bond, which friends so far have been unable to secure.
Pugh was convicted of "possession, distribution, sale and public display" of communistic literature advocating the overthrow of the American form of government by force. The guilty verdict was returned in less than 30 minutes.
The case was tried in the Oregon criminal syndicalism law.
