JOHN H. DEVLIN, PIONEER SON, IS CALLED TO REST

John Henry Devlin, recently of Ruch, Oregon, where he has been making his home with his sister, Mrs. Miles Cantrall, passed away at Sacred Heart hospital, Thursday evening at 6:35 after a brief illness, from an acute kidney abscess. Mr. Devlin was born at Ashland, Oregon, Feb. 17, 1871, of pioneer parents, John and Annie Devlin.

He graduated from the Ashland schools, and from the second class of the Ashland Normal and business college.

He taught school in the early days, and clerked in the Jacksonville store of Reames and White, also worked as reporter and business manager on the Democrat Times. Later he traveled extensively through the Pacific northwest in real estate work and went into art picture in Portland, Oregon, and the Hood River valley.

He then became president of the Imperial Sales company, art pictures and paintings, with headquarters in Portland. He was a member of Portland lodge of Elks.

During recuperation after a major operation over two years ago, Mr. Devlin resided with his sister on the Applegate, where he enjoyed a steady improvement in health. In southern Oregon sun, but the kidney abscess which came about suddenly was more than he could stand.
