## NEW BEER RULINGS TO BAN RESIDENCE DISTRICT SALOONS

withholding action on all drug store and grocery applications for beer licenses for 1935.

Sammis explained that under the current ruling, grocery stores in towns of less than 5000 population will not be given a retail beer license. The drug store order applies whether or not lunches are served in the place. Sammis said as long as the meals are served in the drug store the place is termed a "drug store" and not a "restaurant." One drug store operator here mentioned, however, that the state collects a "restaurant tax" for drug stores serving meals.

Road houses also were hit by the new order of things. No license will be issued to such an out-of-town place "where the principal business is entertainment or the serving of alcoholic beverages or where dancing is permitted," the commission said.

Road houses may qualify for restaurant licenses to serve beer and light wine to customers seated at tables, but the drinks must be served with bona fide meals. Another condition is that dancing must be "incidental" to the business and that there be no charge for dancing.

## HEN TURKS HIGHER PORTLAND TODAY

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 21.—(AP)—Turkey prices were steady to firm and higher for hens here today as receipts diminished and the demand for hens increased.

Turkey toms were 23 1/2 to 25 cents for good birds, and 23 to 24 cents generally. Hens ranged from 24 1/2 to 26 cents a pound, but were chiefly 25 cents for top quality.

The last minute rush of a truck-load of turkeys from Roseburg to San Francisco was reported as the spectacular finish of the shipping for Christmas. The truck was said to have left about midnight with orders to make all possible speed to the bay city.
