MIXOLOGISTS GIVE ADVICE ON PROPER YULETIDE DRINKS

NEW YORK, Dec. 22.—(UP)—New York's professional drink dieters tonight set about the task of advising the nation of the proper alcoholic way to celebrate Yuletide.
 Oscar of the Waldorf, Curley O'Connor of the Ritz, Dan Donnelly of the Biltmore, Vic Ferrasin of the Sherry Netherland—among the loftiest cocktail benders in the metropolis—offered a list of recipes that should appeal to the most genteel tastes.
 However, for those persons who would like to go on a real binge and are interested more in effect than method, try drinking a bottle of beer out of a soup plate with a spoon.
 This was passed on by Al, the bartender at the oyster bar around the corner.
 "One round," said Al, "and it will make you want to shilly up the Christmas tree. Two, and you'll think you're the stratosphere balloon."
 Dan Donnelly offers his Biltmore cocktail as the Yuletide lubricant: one-fourth Italian vermouth, three-fourths dry gin, dash of Maraschino and a hazel nut (the distinctive touch). Shake well and drink.
 The pinconette is Vic Ferrasin's favorite. The head man at the Sherry Netherland bar mixed one-fourth jigger of gin, one-half jigger of amber punch, a fourth jigger of French vermouth and three dashes of gum syrup. Shake, strain and swallow.
 Chris, the man across the street, offered a simple one that anybody can try. Pour a half pint of rye into a tumbler, drink well, and shaka.

CODDING ADVOCATES MORE TEETH IN LAW AGAINST RADICALISM

PORTLAND, Dec. 22.—(AP)—A recommendation that Oregon's criminal syndicalism law be strengthened, rather than repealed, was brought to the annual convention of the District Attorneys' association of Oregon here today by George Coddling, Jackson county prosecutor.
 Suggested amendments to the Oregon liquor control act also occupied the attention of the district attorneys at the opening session of their two-day meeting.
 Answering the pleas of some groups that the criminal syndicalism law be repealed, District Attorney Coddling declared, "My idea is that we ought to put more teeth in the law rather than wipe it off the statute books."
 Coddling said he will ask the resolutions committee to advocate that the state legislature strengthen the law by returning to it certain provisions which were stricken from it by the 1933 legislature.
 Several amendments to the liquor control law were suggested at the round-table discussion by the men who have the responsibility of prosecuting violators of the law.
 One proposal was that the justice courts be given concurrent jurisdiction with the circuit courts over all violations of the so-called Knox law. The idea was favorably received and probably will be incorporated among the resolutions.

RUTH JUDD MAKES XMAS PRESENTS

PHOENIX, Ariz., Dec. 22.—(AP)—Winnie Ruth Judd, Arizona's "blond tigress," who in 1931 was charged with killing Agnes Ann Lerol and Hedwig Samuelson and stuffing their dismembered bodies into a trunk, was embroidering Christmas presents for friends when seen by a reporter today for the first time in recent months.
 Mrs. Judd, a patient at the state hospital for the insane, is described by hospital attendants as having "changed." The fire and temper which marked her numerous courtroom appearances until she was declared insane, are gone, and she is "meek and humble."
 She has become proficient at sewing and hair-dressing. Care for the tresses of other inmates of the women's ward is a part of her regular routine by choice.

BAD CHECK PASSER ALLOWED FREEDOM
