HOLLYWOOD GIRL GLAD TO BE FREE OF NAZI BASTILE

NEW YORK, Dec. 26.—(AP)—Isobel Steele, dark haired Hollywood girl who was held four months in Moshbit prison in Berlin by Nazi political police, returned to the United States today on the liner President Harding "too nervous to tell of my experiences."

"I'm so nervous," she exclaimed. "I can't possibly tell you what happened to me." "Yes," added the representative of a periodical who met her on the boat, "she is on the verge of nervous hysteria. Don't ask her any questions."

Before leaving her third class cabin, however, she gave her opinion of the experience which befell her after she was arrested for alleged espionage and held incommunicado in Moshbit prison. For a 1/2 documentary charges were never presented in the case, which was concluded when the American consular authorities effected her release.

"I have been four months in prison and I am plenty glad to get home," she said while waiting nervously to disembark.

166 DEATHS LISTED ON HOLIDAY, MAINLY IN AUTO ACCIDENTS (Continued from page one.) burned fatally at San Diego, Calif., and a farmer perished in the same manner near Madison, Minn. At Albany, N. Y., a woman was asphyxiated while preparing her Christmas breakfast, and an Albany man was burned to death in his shack.

A blaze in New York City which started from a short circuit in a Christmas tree lighting system caused injuries to four persons. Three were hurt in an explosion and fire in a Newport, R. I., tenement, and three others were injured in a fire which destroyed their home at Belding, Mich.

Deaths by Gunplay Gunplay was responsible for several deaths. A South Carolina farmer was accidentally killed by a shotgun in the hands of his fifteen-year-old daughter. A prowler was shot to death in Chicago. Rex Pyle, owner of a jewelry store in Chicago, was shot and killed in the home of Fred Frenier. An 11-year-old boy was accidentally killed at Shreveport, La., by a rifle he received for a Christmas gift. Louisiana also reported a fatal stabbing. One man was shot to death at Evans, Ky. Alabama gun fights accounted for three deaths. A bank robber was slain in Nebraska. Fatal hunting accidents were reported from Mississippi and Missouri.

Discovery of the body of Mrs. Loretta Wilson, in a thicket at Port Jefferson, N. Y., and the death of Rene Katz, six months old, who was strangled to death in his Little Rock, Ark., home when his sleeping suit twisted about his neck, were among the tragedies reported.

Sylvia Stredman, 18, of Preston, Idaho, was drowned when her car skidded on an icy highway and overturned in a shallow stream. Two young girls were drowned when they broke through the ice on the Blue river near Crete, Neb. Leroy Maple, 17, of Brownsville, Pa., a farmer boy, gave his own life in saving two boys from drowning while skating. Two persons were drowned in Ohio.

More than a dozen persons chose Christmas to end their lives. In the nation's metropolises eight persons killed in the town of New York left a note on which was written: "Merry Christmas."

DUCK HUNTING SEASON ENDED

Duck hunting season came to a close on Sunday, and was considered by local sportsmen as one of the lightest seasons in recent years. Although during the first several weeks many birds were brought back to Medford, with reports that in neighboring marsh and lake areas duck and geese were numerous.

It is believed by leading sportsmen that more interest was taken this year in hunting upland game birds than migratory waterfowl, and if Oregon figures are comparable to figures recently issued from California, more licenses were issued for upland game birds than for waterfowl by percentage approximating ten to one.
