NEW DEAL' BOOKS SURPRISE SELLERS MARK PUBLISHING Sales Slump in Middle of Year Not Explained—Many Volumes Found Wholly Inspired by Politics By JOHN SELBY NEW YORK.—(P)—The year 1934 brought an unexpected slump and a curious recovery to the book publishers. The slump came about the middle of the year, and no one has quite explained it yet. Within the last few weeks there has been a revival, partly due to the holiday season, but not wholly. For, say the bookmen, the public interest seems to be more in older books and what may be called the "general run," and not especially in best sellers, as might be expected at the end of a year. The year has produced some surprises, but few books which sweep everything before them—books like "Anthony Adverse," for example. On the "New Deal," Nor has there been a definite trend observable, as occasionally there has been in the past. The number of books on economic subjects has been reduced somewhat; politics continue to inspire numerous writers, however, particularly writers connected with the "new deal" and opposition thereto.
