But many of these people, who face the camera but never are photographed, are too busy to spend much time feeling sorry for themselves, or even to speculate on their almost-starving, their constant condition of being so near and yet so far from fame.

There's Leo Lynn, who "stands in" for Bing Crosby. After hours and between pictures, Leo is Bing's Man Friday and has a steady job. And Louise "Cracker" Henderson, who has the same arrangement with Jack Oakie, doesn't go around feeling sorry for himself.

Greta Garbo's stand-in is Chris Marie Meeker, who, like the star, is tall and blonde. When Garbo is not working, Miss Meeker busies herself with her dolls, painting portraits.

Jane Clark has been Kay Francis' stand-in for six years. When Kay was under study to Kay Johnson in a Broadway play, Jane had a small bit in the production. When Kay came to Hollywood, Jane came, too, and she has "stood in" for the same star ever since.

Another stand-in with artistic leanings is Babe Cain, who has served Helen Twelvetrees, Ginger Rogers and other young actresses at one time or another. Frank McGrath, friend and stand-in to Warner Baxter, makes extra money with his fine horsemanship in pictures, and recently played a small role himself.

Mat Gilmon, Wallace Beery's "second self," is, like the star, a pilot, and a stunt man besides. Warren William has for stand-in a practicing chiropractor, Warren "Doc" Dearborn.

When Jane Downey isn't busy standing in for Gloria Stuart or Jean Muir, she can turn her talents to stunting, for she rates well among the stunt women of movieland.

The average stand-in, if his or her star happens not to be working, and other stand-in jobs are not available, is on hand for extra work, but when Franchot Tone is between pictures, Bob Evans, his stand-in, is an assistant director.

Joe E. Brown's stand-in, Pat O'Shea, is one of the few who bear a great resemblance to the stars they serve in this capacity. Another reason Joe likes him is that Pat is a professional baseball player, and between pictures he strengthens one of the semi-pro teams the comedian has organized in Hollywood.

RUBY BITTERLING OF EAGLE POINT PASSES IN SALEM HOSPITAL

Ruby Bitterling, well known resident of Eagle Point, passed away in Salem, January 7, at the age of 44 years, where she had gone for medical treatment last September. Penwell, Gold Hill, one brother, Anlo Penwell, Medford, one sister, Valentine Morse of Tucson, Ariz., also two half-brothers, Walter Hadd-cliff of Eagle Point and Thomas Berry of Medford.

Funeral services will be conducted from the Conger funeral parlors, Thursday at 2 p. m. Rev. W. B. Baird will have charge of services at the chapel and interment services at the I. O. O. F. cemetery in Medford will be conducted by the Eagle Point Orange, of which Mrs. Bitterling was an active member and officer.




