PORTLAND, Jan. 17.—(AP)—Butter prices were higher today, prime firsts and extras advancing 1 to 2c. Butterfat quotations were unchanged.

Trading in the egg market retained a steady tone as a rule, but prices were mixed with competing influences. Receipts showed little change in late totals.

Strong demand was showing for live chickens along the wholesale way with prices well sustained at late advances. Turkeys were about steady for dressed stock with the chief call for storage.

There continued much strength in the market for country-killed meats except for heavy grades, but these were at least steady. Daily cleanup of all arrivals was suggested.
