

28 SAILORS SAVED FROM SEA; CAPTAIN LAST OFF, DROWNS

Shore Dwellers Rescue Crew of Stranded Vessel During Blizzard — Ship Batters to Pieces On Rocks

HALIFAX, N. S., Jan. 18.—(P)—Capt. Duncan Milne, last man left aboard the stranded freighter Kenkerry, as she broke up on Black Rock Point, was drowned today as he climbed into the breeches buoy that had carried 28 of his crew to safety. The Kenkerry was rapidly being battered to pieces on the rocks. Wet to the skin by spray, the rescued seamen were given hot food and bundled into bed in homes of Portuguese Cove fishermen. Deep snowdrifts piled up by the blizzard threatened to keep them marooned in the little village for days. Tugs Unable Locate Ship. Round for Halifax to load grain for the United Kingdom, the Kenkerry struck shortly after 10 p. m. yesterday. An SOS sent out at 10:25 p. m. brought the tugs Banabee and Bon Scot out of Halifax harbor, but they were unable to locate her in the blinding snowstorm. Half an hour later, the Kenkerry's operator, using an emergency radio, reported that the engine-room was flooded and the lighting system had failed.

Meanwhile the people of Portuguese Cove had heard distress signals. For hours they were in doubt about the vessel's position, but a lull in the storm about 2 a. m. revealed her less than 100 yards from the point. Signal With Lights. Immediately a score of men started along the shore, carrying lanterns, ropes and other equipment. C. R. Spracklin, manager of East Coast Radio's C. C. Radio station, arrived on the scene in a car, with Operator Williams and Cox, and the three braved roaring breakers to stand on a projecting rock and signal with powerful flashlights to the stranded steamer. When answering lights from the vessel indicated they were understood, the operators gave the shipwrecked crew instructions. The first of the 28 to start across the line shortly after 4 a. m. had to be hauled back aboard when the basket struck halfway between the vessel and land. A second line was rocketed from the Kenkerry to a group of fishermen composing the rescue party. One by one the sailors hauled themselves hand over hand to safety. The rescue was completed before daylight.

Instruction will start immediately after enrollment, and any persons interested in taking the course should be there promptly at the time set. Seth Bullis, chairman of first aid instruction in the local Red Cross chapter, states that this will probably be the only general class held this season in Medford. As the class is limited to about 30 persons, early enrollment is desirable.

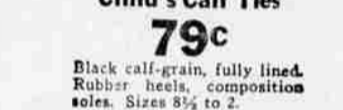

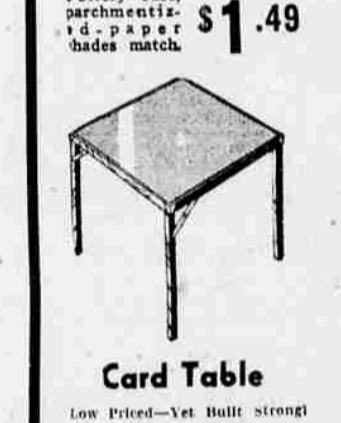

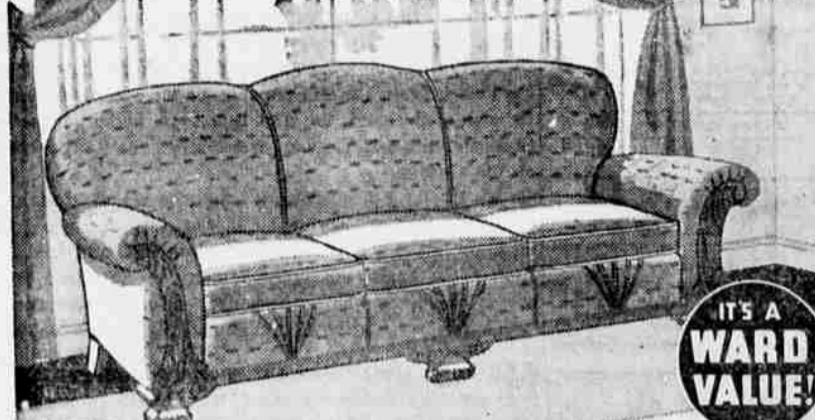
