

VALLEY SOIL SOAKED TO GREATEST DEPTH IN PAST FIVE YEARS

Moisture conditions in the Rogue River valley are now the same as in 1932, which was a fairly wet year, according to Glen Arnsperger, general manager of the Medford and Talent Irrigation districts. This year, furthermore, has the advantage of more rain and wetter ground.

Arnsperger says that the chief concern now is securing of enough water in the irrigation reservoirs, so there can be a surplus. He does not like the idea of draining the reservoirs. While more water is expected to be available for irrigation than last year, conservation will probably be practiced to prepare for another dry year.

Five feet of snow now lies at Fish Lake, the main irrigation water source of the Medford district. Close to four feet is reported from Hatt Prairie, and about the same depth prevails on the Emigrant Dam watershed.

On the floor of the valley, due to rain and furies of snow the past six weeks, the ground is water-soaked to the greatest depth in five years, according to Fruit Inspector Howard Warner. Conditions are such that predictions are made that the water-table will be the nearest to normal in five years.

All the streams of the county show slight rises.

FARM CENSUS IN COUNTY DELAYED

The federal farm census in Jackson county is not apt to get underway for two months, according to R. O. Stephenson, who reports that he has been advised by Supervisor Finley of Eugene, that owing to the lack of assistants, slow progress is being made. Supervisor Finley has charge of 18 western Oregon counties, and has one assistant.

Naming of the census enumerators, and taking of the census, was started in Polk and Marion counties this week, and similar steps are being taken in other counties as fast as possible. Stephenson thinks that Jackson county will be among the last where the work will be inaugurated.

Fourteen enumerators will be named in this county, and applicants will take an examination before any appointments are made. No date has been set for the examinations.

REED WILL SEEK MARTIN CLEMENCY

Albert W. Reed's plea for pardon, from a life term in state prison for the slaying of Victor Knott, Ashland policeman in November 1932, will be presented to Governor Martin, after the legislature adjourns. Attorney Gus Newbury said today. The pardon petition was presented to former Governor Meier, who, owing to lack of time, took no official action upon it.

Counsel for Reed said they would wait until the bustle and bustle of the legislative session and official duties had calmed, before renewing their petition for a pardon hearing.

Reed, in his plea for leniency, claims he was a victim of circumstances and faulty identification, and that newly discovered evidence shows he was not at the scene of the murder.

District Attorney George A. Coddling filed a brief with the governor's office protesting clemency.

SOLINSKY GUEST OF FRIENDS HERE

E. C. (Al) Solinsky, former superintendent of Crater Lake National park under federal indictment for alleged misappropriation of funds, and due to enter a plea Monday morning in federal court at Portland, is now visiting friends in this city and valley, acquaintances said today, and has been here for several days.

Since his ouster as park head, Solinsky has been residing in the San Francisco bay district.

In federal court Monday, Attorney George M. Roberts, counsel for Solinsky, is expected to request that his client be tried here at the next term of the federal court for the southern Oregon district. The regular term is held in October of each year. Granting of the request is optional with the court.

E. L. (Doc) Davidson, ex-park commissioner, and R. A. Edwin, former park warden, indicted with Solinsky, have entered pleas of guilty.
